A R T I C L E S   O F   I N C O R P O R A T I O N

OF

GRANGEVILLE GUN CLUB, INC.

5 KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, the undersigned, have  
6 associated and do hereby associate ourselves together for the pur-  
7 pose of forming a non-profit cooperative association pursuant to  
8 the provisions of Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code (1949), and all  
9 laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and do hereby  
10 make, subscribe and certify as follows:

## ARTICLE I.

The name of the corporation is GRANGEVILLE GUN CLUB, INC.

## ARTICLE II.

14 The location of the registered office of the corporation shall  
15 be Grangeville, County of Idaho, State of Idaho, and the address  
16 of the registered office of the corporation shall be Grangeville,  
17 Idaho.

### ARTICLE III.

19 The purposes for which the corporation is formed are to do  
20 any or all things hereinafter set forth to the same extent that  
21 natural persons might or could do in any part of the world so long  
22 as pecuniary profit is not their object, namely:

23       A. To promote interest in hunting, trap shooting, skeet shoot-  
24 ing, rifle shooting, pistol shooting, fishing, bait casting, boating  
25 and other lawful sports; to aid in the protection of fish, birds,  
26 and game, and to promote and provide social&athletic recreation  
27 for its members; to give and promote entertainments, lectures,  
28 social affairs, celebrations, exhibitions, games, amusements of  
29 any and all descriptions for the general enjoyment and instruction  
30 of the members; to provide shooting matches among its own members  
31 and members of other similarly constituted organizations for the  
32 benefit, enjoyment, instruction, and well being of its members;

1 to establish and own shooting galleries, trap houses, and skeet  
2 houses and the necessary equipment for them; to purchase or lease  
3 and to maintain and operate building, club houses, or other struc-  
4 tures that are incidental to the above purposes, and to sell, lease,  
5 mortgage, or otherwise dispose of the same.

6 B. To acquire, by lease, purchase, gift, devise, contract,  
7 concession, or otherwise, and to hold, own, develop, explore, ex-  
8 ploit, improve, operate, lease, enjoy, control, manage, or other-  
9 wise turn to accounts. mortgage, grant, sell, exchange, convey, or  
10 otherwise dispose of, wherever situated, within or without the  
11 State of Idaho, any and all real estate, lands, options, concessions,  
12 grants, land patents, franchises, rights, privileges, easements,  
13 tenements, estates, hereditaments, interests, and properties of  
14 every kind, nature and description whatsoever.

15 C. To enter into, make, and perform contracts of every kind  
16 and description with any person, firm, association or corporation,  
17 municipality, body politics, country, territory, state, government,  
18 or colony or dependency thereof.

19 D. To perform services of every kind and nature authorized  
20 by law for any person, firm, association, or corporation.

21 E. To carry out the objects and purposes for principal,  
22 agents, or otherwise, to the same extent as natural persons might do.

23 F. To conduct the business of this corporation as herein set  
24 out at any place or places within the State of Idaho, or in any  
25 other state or territory of the United States, as the Board of  
26 Directors, may, from time to time, determine.

27 G. It is the intention of the incorporators that the fore-  
28 going clauses shall be construed both as objects and powers and  
29 the foregoing enumeration of specific powers shall not be construed  
30 to limit or restrict in any way the powers of the corporation, but  
31 that said corporation shall have power to do all and everything  
32 necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of

1 any of its purposes, or the attainment of any of one or more of  
2 the objects herein enumerated, or incidental to the powers herein  
3 named, or which shall appear at any time conducive or expedient for  
4 the protection or benefit of the corporation, permitted by the Act  
5 under which this corporation is formed and pursuant to the laws of  
6 the State of Idaho, and this to the same extent and as fully as  
7 natural persons might or could do.

#### ARTICLE IV.

9        The corporation shall be nonstock and no dividends or pecuniary  
10      profits shall be declared to the members thereof. This corporation  
11      shall issue membership certificates to each member hereof, the  
12      qualifications for being and becoming a member shall be fully set  
13      out in the by-laws of this corporation, and said certificates can  
14      not be assigned except by resolution of the Board of Directors and  
15      under such regulations as the by-laws may provide.

## ARTICLE V.

17 The general officers of the corporation shall be a president,  
18 vice-president, secretary and treasurer, and the offices of sec-  
19 retary and treasurer may be combined, and the Board of Directors  
20 shall consist of not less than three nor more than thirty members  
21 as set forth in the by-laws.

22        The principal duties of the officers of the corporation shall  
23        be the usual and regular duties of those usually prescribed to the  
24        president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer of a corporation,  
25        which duties are more particularly outlined in the laws of the  
26        State of Idaho, and will be more particularly defined in the by-laws  
27        herein adopted. The said officers shall perform such additional  
28        and different duties as shall be from time to time imposed or re-  
29        quired by the Board of Directors or as may be prescribed from time  
30        to time by the by-laws. Each and every officer of this corpora-  
31        tion and member of the Board of Directors must be a member of this  
32        corporation.

## ARTICLE VI.

The said corporation shall have perpetual existence.

## ARTICLE VII.

4 The private property of the members of the corporation shall  
5 not be subject to the payment of, and no member shall be individ-  
6 ually responsible for, corporate debts or acts to any extent what-  
7 ever without his consent thereto in writing.

## ARTICLE VIII.

9 The rights and interests of all members shall be equal and no  
10 member can have or acquire a greater interest therein than any  
11 other member.

## ARTICLE IX.

13 The incorporators of the corporation shall be members of the  
14 corporation. Any natural person, in addition to the incorporators  
15 of the corporation, may become a member of the corporation by:

- A. Being recommended and voted upon for membership as specified in the by-laws of the corporation.
- B. Paying the membership fee specified in the by-laws of the corporation.
- C. Agreeing to comply with and be bound by the Articles of Incorporation and any amendments thereof and such rules and regulations as may from time to time be adopted by the Board of Directors of the corporation, provided, however, that no person shall become a member of the corporation unless and until he has been accepted for membership by the affirmative vote of three-fourths of the members present at the annual meeting, and provided further that the voting upon the candidates for membership shall be done only in and during the annual meeting of the corporation, and that any person may be expelled from membership by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members of the corporation to make such expulsion.

## ARTICLE X.

27        Each member shall be entitled to one (1) vote for himself and  
28 for one and only one proxy vote, and no more, upon each matter sub-  
29 mitted to a vote at a meeting of the members and at all meetings of  
30 the members at which a quorum is present, all questions shall be  
31 decided by a vote of the majority of the members present in person  
32 or represented by proxy. The election of directors shall be by

1 ballot and each member shall have the right to cast as many votes  
2 as there are directors to be elected at such election, provided  
3 that no member may cast more than one (1) vote for any single can-  
4 didate. The terms of the directors shall be specified in the by-  
5 laws of the corporation.

## ARTICLE XI.

7        The by-laws of the corporation may define and fix the duties  
8 and responsibilities of the members and prescribe such other terms  
9 and conditions upon which members shall be admitted to and retain  
10 membership in the corporation not inconsistent with these Articles  
11 of Incorporation or the Act under which the organization is organ-  
12 ized.

## ARTICLE XII.
