

Articles of Incorporation
of the Wardner Miners' Union!

I now all men by these presents, That we,
the undersigned members of the Wardner
Miners' Union Association, already organized
and existing at Wardner, Idaho Territory, being
desirous of incorporating such Union, have this
day voluntarily associated ourselves together
for the purpose of forming a Corporation
thereof under the laws of the Territory of Idaho,
not only for ourselves, but for the benefit
of all the members of such Association and
all persons to become members,

And we hereby certify;

That the name of said Corporation is, and
shall be, known as "The Wardner Miners' Union" of
Wardner, Idaho.

II.

That such corporation is not organized for
the purpose of profit, but is organized under
Chapter 8, of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes of Idaho
Territory, providing for the incorporation of
religious, social and benevolent corporations,
and has for its purposes among other things, and
hereby claims for such purposes "to promote
the practice of those virtues that elevate and
adorn Society and remind man of his duty
to his fellow man; the elevation of his position
and the maintenance of the rights of miners;
the promotion and protection of our common
interests and the common interests of such

mines of the association; and for the union of its members for such purpose, in order that they may possess sufficient strength to protect themselves from oppression, wrong ^{and} injustice, from whatever source they may come; to promote profitable employment in the retention of skilled and experienced labor where its demand is significant ^{as} necessary, always in proportion to the benefit to be derived from such labor; to cultivate an acquaintance with our fellows, and those of our Union, that we may be better enabled to form an undivided opposition to all acts of injustice of every kind and nature.

III

The powers of this Corporation shall be set forth in the Constitution and By-Laws hereof adopted and particularly such corporation shall have power to own, hold and possess both real ^{and} personal property, of sufficient kind, quantity and nature, for all the purposes of this corporation at any time, to charge initiation fee for any person being duly elected under the Constitution and By-Laws hereof. To levy upon its members for extraordinary purposes such tax or sum as may be, at the time such levy is made, deemed in the sense of the members of this Corporation urgent ^{as} necessary, limiting the tax, however, so that the same shall not at any time exceed the sum of Five (5) per cent of the wages or earnings of any of its members. To prevent the funds of this

Union or Corporation from being divided, amongst its members as long as such Corporation shall exist and ten (10) members of the Association are willing to continue in it in good standing. To prevent donations from being made from the funds of the corporation but to keep the same the property of the Corporation for its legitimate purposes so long as the ten members are willing to continue the same, as aforesaid; To discipline, fine, admit, suspend or expel any member or members of this Corporation or Association, not however, until after a fair trial; provided the same involved suspension or expulsion. Such power is to be regulated, however, by the Constitution and By-Laws of this Corporation. Such Corporation shall also have the power generally to transact any and all business relative thereto; to also mortgage or sell any of their real or personal property as may be provided by the Constitution and By-Laws of this Corporation, on which shall be decided by a majority of the members thereof, within the limits prescribed by the Act under which this Corporation is had.

And also to collect funds, dues and assessments from its members, and to assist any member in good standing who by sickness or accident may be rendered incapable of following his usual vocation, in such sums and such manner as the members of this Corporation may from time to time determine;

IV.

The qualification for members of the Wadner
Miners' Union, thus incorporated, must be men
of good moral character, residents of Wadner
or vicinity, and shall be admitted by an elec-
tion, the mode of which shall be determined
by the Constitution and By-Laws of this Corpo-
ration. The fee for such admission shall
be not less than two dollars and fifty cents
(\$2.50), and any member of this Corpora-
tion or persons who may become members, can be
expelled or suspended as members, for mis-con-
duct or non-payment of dues, at this Corpora-
tion or its members may direct. And can, in
like manner, be restored to membership upon
a vote of this Union.

V.

No Board of Trustees, or the Officers of this
Corporation, or its members, shall contract any
indebtedness against this Corporation to exceed
the sum of Four Thousand (\$4000.00) Dollars at
any one time, nor shall they secure or pay any
sum without first having the same passed upon
by the Board of Trustees hereof, and submitted
to the Union at one of its regular meetings.

VI.

This Corporation and its members thereof shall
have power to make regulations for the disci-
plining and controlling and properly directing
the members of this Union, in such manner,
under such regulations, as are beneficial to
the objects of the Corporation, and not repug-

nant to the laws of the Territory, and in
harmony with the objects of the Mines' Union,
and this Corporation.

VII,

That the place where the principal busi-
ness of this Corporation is to be transacted
shall be the Town of Wardner, County of Sho-
shone, Territory of Idaho.

VIII,

That the term for which it is to exist is
20 years from and after the date of its incor-
poration.

IX,

That the number of its Directors shall be
five (5) and that the names and residences of
those who are appointed for the first year
are as follows, to wit; W. S. Sherman
and John Cassidy, Wesley Willson and
W. P. Swinton and George M. Brown all
members of the present Wardner Mines' Union,
and all residents of Wardner and its vicinity.

And we furthermore recite and allege herein,
that at an election of the Wardner Mines' Union,
held at its Hall in the Town of Wardner, County
and Territory aforesaid, on the 26th day of
January, 1889, for the election of Trustees
for such Corporation, that a majority of
the members of such Wardner Mines' Union
who were present and voted at such election,
and the result thereof was the election of the
aforesaid Trustees as Directors, for the term
of one year, as appears by the affidavit

X.

The officers of this Corporation shall consist of a president, vice-president, recording Secretary, financial Secretary, treasurer, conductor, warden, and a standing committee of three for financial business, who shall serve for such term as the Constitution and By-Laws of this Corporation shall determine, and who shall be elected by ballot and no one shall be elected but by a plurality of the votes cast, but no officer shall hold the same office more than twice in succession, except he be a member who is disabled from earning a living by manual labor.

XI.

This Corporation and its members thereof, shall have power to adopt a Constitution in harmony with these Articles of Incorporation, and By-Laws for its government, which shall be adopted at a regular meeting of the Corporation, and changes thereof shall be made as regulated by such Constitution and By-Laws, at such regular meetings.
