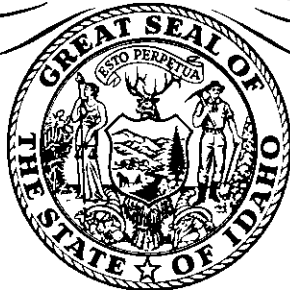

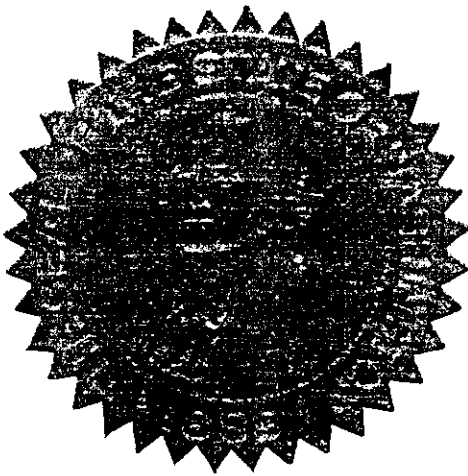

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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SPOKANE MACHINE CO. COMPANY

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That HEAR C. LINDAHL,
JOSE T. LINDAHL, and JAMES L. PEPLING, all citizens of
the United States and the State of Washington, over the age
of 21 years, residing in the City of Spokane, Washington and
desiring to form a corporation under the laws of the State of
Washington for the purposes hereinafter set forth, do make
and subscribe the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I.

The name of this corporation is SPOKANE MACHINE CO. COMPANY.

The objects for which this corporation is formed are:

(1) To manufacture and sell, lease, exchange, dispose
of and otherwise deal in all kinds of machinery, engineering
and building material, including all kinds of engines, motors,
pumps, etc., and to do all other things which may be necessary
to carry out the purposes of this corporation.

The corporation shall have the right to sell all kinds of
machinery.

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(4) To apply for, obtain, register, purchase, lease or otherwise to acquire and to hold, use, operate, and introduce and sell, assign, pledge, or otherwise dispose of any copyrights, trademarks, trade names, patents, inventions, improvements, formulae and processes used in connection with or secured under letters patent of the United States or of any foreign country or elsewhere and to use, exercise, develop, grant licenses in respect of, or otherwise turn to account, any such copyrights, trademarks, trade names, patents, inventions, improvements, formulae, processes and the like, or any such property or rights and with a view to the working and development thereof to carry on any lawful business which this corporation may consider calculated to effectuate the use, exercise or development thereof.

(5) Subject to the provisions of law, to issue, sell, purchase, retire, redeem, hold, reissue, transfer and otherwise dispose of shares of its own capital stock of any class and to enter into any contracts, agreements, or undertakings of any nature in aid of or otherwise in connection with any issue, sale, purchase, retirement, redemption, holding, reissue, transfer or other disposition of any shares of its capital stock.

(6) To purchase or otherwise acquire the whole or any part of the business, good will, rights, property and assets and to assume and undertake or guarantee the whole or any

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part of the liabilities of any person, partnership, association, or corporation as a going concern or otherwise, and to pay for the same in cash, notes, stock, bonds, debentures, or other securities of this corporation or otherwise in any manner permitted by law.

(7) To borrow money, contract debts, issue and dispose of its obligations, secured or unsecured, for any amount and to mortgage and pledge all or any part of its property and franchises to secure the payment and/or performance of any of its contracts or obligations or of any contract, obligation, or debt contracted for any purpose of its incorporation or in the exercise of any of its corporate rights, privileges, or franchises in any manner permitted by law.

(8) To conduct its business and any or all of its branches and to acquire or dispose of and generally deal with real and personal property and to establish and maintain offices and agencies so far as permitted by law in any state or territory of the United States or America and in the District of Columbia and in any and all dependencies, colonies, or possessions of the United States and in foreign countries.

(9) In general, to do any and all things and exercise any and all powers which may now or hereafter be lawful for the corporation to do or exercise under and in pursuance of the laws of the State of Washington or any other laws that may now or hereafter be applicable to this corporation.

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(10) The foregoing powers shall be construed both as subjects and powers and in furtherance of and not in limitation of the general powers conferred by the State of Washington, and it is hereby expressly provided that the foregoing enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this corporation.

ARTICLE III.

This corporation shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE IV.

The principal office and place of business and registered office of this corporation shall be located at East 3626 Trent Avenue, Spokane, Washington until changed by resolution of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$100,000.00) DOLLARS divided into One Thousand (1,000) shares of common stock of the par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) each.

ARTICLE VI.

The amount of paid-up capital with which the corporation will begin business is SEVEN THOUSAND AND NO/100 (\$70,000.00) DOLLARS.

ARTICLE VII.

This corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of not less than three and more than five, the number

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which shall also be filed by the by-laws.
The following named persons shall serve as Directors of this
corporation for the term expiring on the second Tuesday in
December, 1938, to-wit:

ARTICLE IX.

The Directors of this corporation shall have the power
to make such by-laws as they shall deem proper for the manage-
ment of the corporation and the affairs of the corporation not
inconsistent with the laws of the State of Washington and to
prescribe the duties of the officers and servants that may be
employed, and the conduct of business of all business within

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the objects and purposes of the corporation.
