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CAPITAL SINGLES CIVITAN CLUB, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That we, the undersigned, being natural persons of full age, citizens of the United States and residents of the State of Idaho, this day have voluntarily associated ourselves for the purpose of forming a non-profit cooperative association under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code, and we hereby certify as follows:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be CAPITAL SINGLES CIVITAN CLUB, INC.

ARTICLE II

The period of existence of this non-profit cooperative association shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE III

The principal place of business and registered office of this non-profit cooperative association shall be in Boise, Ada County, Idaho.

ARTICLE IV

This corporation shall be a non-profit corporation, organized for the purpose of building and citizenship. The aim of CAPITAL SINGLES CIVITAN CLUB, INC. is to develop in its members, their associates and their communities, a high sense of responsibility toward common problems.

In order to accomplish this purpose the members of Capital Singles Civitan Club shall meet regularly to have fellowship together, to acquire a broader knowledge of public affairs and community needs, and thus become better prepared for intelligent leadership and cooperation in the solving of civic problems through study and instruction, and each member shall seek out opportunities to render altruistic service to mankind.

ARTICLE V

To carry out the foregoing purposes the Corporation shall have the following powers:

- 1. To receive gifts, donations, grants of money and property directly or in trust, or otherwise, residual estates and all and any other means from any foundation, citizen municipality, state, United States delivered to said association, for any purpose generally or incidental to the purposes for which the association is formed, as aforesaid, the association, however, retaining the right to reject such gifts, grants, or transfers should the same contain conditions repugnant to the principles upon which the association is founded.
- 2. Unless contrary to the conditions under which such funds were received, to give funds or property of the association to qualified persons, who, in the discretion of the members of the Association shall be entitled thereto, but always within the context of the purposes of this association and/or the purposes for which said funds were received by the association.

- 3. To borrow money, and lend money and draw, make, accept, endorse, transfer, assign or issue bonds, debentures, notes or other evidence of indebtedness.
- 4. To make gifts, donations, contributions or loans of money or property for the purposes and objects set forth in these articles.
- 5. To do any and all such other acts, things, business or businesses in any manner connected with or necessary, incidental, convenient or auxiliary to any of the objects hereinbefore enumerated or calculated, directly or indirectly, to promote the purposes of the association; and in carrying on its purposes or for the purpose of attaining or furthering any of its purposes, to do any and all acts and things, and to exercise any and all other powers which a natural person could do or exercise and which now or hereafter may be authorized by law.

ARTICLE VI

The association shall not have capital stock, but its capital shall be represented by membership certificates.

The Board of Directors may establish and set up as many types of membership in this association as they may at any annual meeting decide upon and not in conflict with Civitan International. Evidence of membership in this association may be shown by such means as the Board of Directors here of may decide from year to year or as may be directed by Civitan International. The rights and interests of all members shall be equal and no member may have or acquire a greater interest than any other member.

ARTICLE VII

Any person over the age of eighteen, who is single is eligible for membership. Once a membership has been established, a change in marital status does not terminate said membership.

ARTICLE VIII

The affairs of this association shall be conducted by a Board of Directors of at least five in number, with the exact number, manner of selection and qualifications as determined by the bylaws.

ARTICLE IX

The following provisions are hereby adopted for the purpose of defining, limiting and regulating the powers of the association and its directors.

- 1. No part of the net earnings of the association shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to any director, member or other private individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article IV hereof. The corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.
- 2. In the event the existence of the corporation shall for any reason be terminated, all funds of the corporation shall, after the payment of its liabilities, be distributed exclusively for charitable purposes.

3. Not withstanding any other provisions of these articles, the association shall not engage in any transaction which is a prohibited transaction as defined in Section 503(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or the corresponding provisions of any subsequent United States Revenue Laws.

ARTICLE X

These articles may be amended in any manner permitted or authorized by law by the favorable vote of a two-thirds majority of the members present or represented by proxy at a meeting of the members duly called upon notice for the specific purpose thereof in accordance with the statutes of the State of Idaho.

ARTICLE XI
