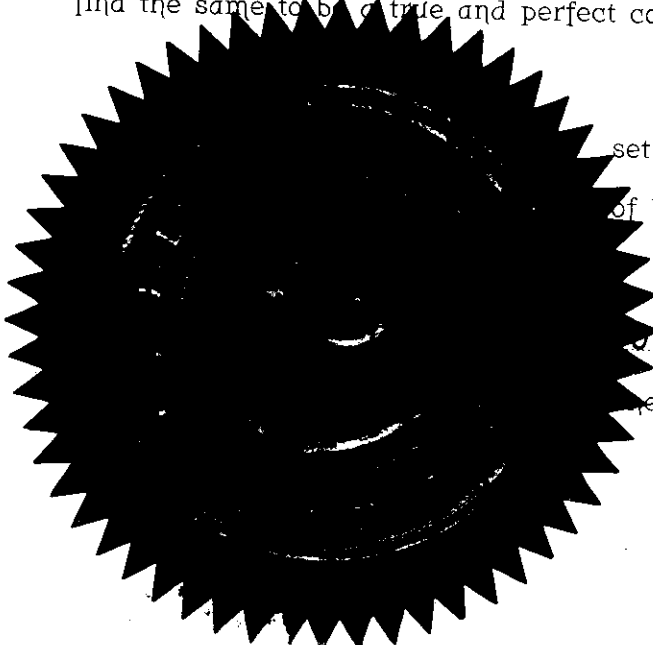

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF THE

TIGER MERCANTILE COMPANY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that we, the undersigned citizens of the United States, and of the State of Washington, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Washington; and to that end we now certify as follows:

ARTICLE I.

THE NAME of the said corporation shall be The Tiger Mercantile Company.

ARTICLE II.

THE OBJECTS for which said corporation is formed are to engage in a general mercantile business; to buy and sell merchandise, personal property, real estate, and to run hotels; to buy, sell, negotiate, discount, and deal in, bonds, warrants, drafts, and other securities; to purchase from the subscribers to the capital stock such property, both real and personal, and rights and privileges, and other things of value as may be useful and necessary to promote the objects for which this corporation is created, and to receive the same in payment of subscriptions to the capital stock in such amounts as the board of trustees may think proper, and to issue full paid-up stock therefor.

ARTICLE III.

THE AMOUNT of the capital stock of said corporation shall be Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20000) divided into Four Hundred (400) shares of the par value of Fifty Dollars (\$50) each.

ARTICLE IV.

THE TERM for which said corporation is formed is Fifty (50) years from and after this date.

ARTICLE V.

THE NUMBER OF TRUSTEES of said corporation shall be three (3); and the names and residences of the trustees who are appointed to manage the concerns of the company for six months from this date, and until the election and qualification of their successors, are as follows, to-wit: J. S. Glidden, Spokane, Washington;

W. J. Hall, Spokane, Washington; and, J. R. Cuthbertson
Burke Selby Spokane, Washington.

ARTICLE VI.

THE PRINCIPAL PLACE of business of said corporation shall be at the city of Spokane, State of Washington, and the said corporation shall have such other branch places of business, in the States of Washington and Idaho, as the board of trustees may designate.
