I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates and successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name hereinbefore stated, for
perpetual existence from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located at

Boise in the County of **Ada.**

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

STATE STREET BUILDING, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned, Martin Olsen, Jr., Jerold L. Wood and Raymond C. Gambling, each being a natural person of full age, and a citizen of the United States of America, have voluntarily and do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and we do hereby certify, declare and adopt the following articles of incorporation:

I

The name of this corporation shall be STATE STREET BUILDING, INC.

II

The period of existence and duration of the life of this corporation shall be perpetual.

III

The location of the registered office of this corporation shall be Boise, County of Ada, State of Idaho, and the address

of the registered office of this corporation shall be Boise,
Idaho.

IV

The nature of the business and the objects and purposes
of this corporation shall be:

To buy, lease, and otherwise acquire, lands and interest
in lands of every kind and description, wheresoever situate;
to buy, lease, and otherwise acquire, and to construct and
erect buildings and structures in and on such lands for any
use or purpose; to hold, own, improve, develop, maintain,
operate, let, lease, mortgage, sell, or otherwise dispose of
such property or any part thereof or interest therein; to equip
and operate any type of building and structure.

To conduct and carry on the business of building, erecting,
altering, repairing, wrecking or doing any other work in
connection with any and all classes of buildings and improvements
of any kind and nature whatsoever.

To enter into, make and perform and carry out contracts
of every sort and kind with any person, firm, association or
corporation, municipality, body politic, country, territory,
district, state and government.

To institute, enter into, carry on, assist, promote or participate in financial, commercial, mercantile, industrial and other businesses, works, enterprises, undertakings and operations.

To purchase, hold, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock of, or any bonds, securities or evidence of indebtedness created by, any other corporation or corporations organized under the laws of this state or any other state, country, nation or government, and while the owner thereof to exercise all the rights, powers, and privileges of ownership.

To purchase, apply for, secure, acquire by assignment, own, hold, transfer, or otherwise, and to exercise, carry out and enjoy, any patent right, charter, license, power, authority, franchise, concession, rights or privileges, which any government or authority or any corporation or other public body may be empowered to grant; and to pay for, aid in and contribute toward carrying the same into effect, and to appropriate any of the corporation's shares of stock, bonds and assets to defray the necessary costs, charges and expenses thereof.

To acquire, and pay for in cash, stock or bonds of this

corporation or otherwise, the good-will, rights, assets and property and to undertake or assume the whole or any part of the obligations or liabilities of any person, firm, association or corporation.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, and other negotiable or transferrable instruments.

In the purchase or acquisition of property, business, rights or franchises, or for additional working capital, or for any other object in or about its business or affairs, and without limit as to amount, to incur debt, and to raise, borrow, and secure the payment of money in any lawful manner, including the issue and sale or other disposition of bonds, debentures, obligations, negotiable and transferrable instruments and evidences of indebtedness of all kinds, whether secured by mortgage, pledge, deed of trust or otherwise.

To carry on any other business, which may seem to the corporation capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the corporation's property or rights.

To do each and every thing necessary, suitable, useful or advisable for the accomplishment of any one or more of said objects, or which shall, at any time, appear to be conducive to or expedient for the benefit of said corporation in connection therewith.

To do each and all things set forth herein to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might do or could do in the State of Idaho, and in any other state, country or place.

To purchase, hold, sell and transfer the shares of its own capital stock; provided it shall not use its funds or property for the purchase of its own shares of capital stock when such use would cause any impairment of its capital; and provided further that shares of its own capital stock belonging to it shall not be voted upon directly or indirectly.

To have one or more offices, to carry on all or any of its operations and business and without restriction or limit as to amount, to purchase, or otherwise acquire, to hold, own, to mortgage, sell, convey, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of every class and description.

The foregoing clauses shall be construed as objects, purposes and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that any

enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this corporation.

In general, to carry on any other business in connection with the foregoing, and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by the laws of Idaho upon corporations.

V

In furtherance, and not in limitation of the powers conferred by statute, the board of directors is expressly authorized:

To make and alter by-laws of this corporation, to fix the amount to be reserved as working capital over and above its capital stock paid in, and to authorize and cause to be executed mortgages and liens upon the real and personal property of this corporation.

If the by-laws so provide, to designate two or more of its members to constitute an executive committee, which committee shall for the time being, as provided in said resolution or in the by-laws of this corporation, have and exercise any or all of the powers of the board of directors in the management of the business and affairs of this corporation, and have power to authorize the seal of this corporation to be affixed to all

papers which may require it.

Pursuant to the affirmative vote of the holders of at least a majority of the stock issued and outstanding, having voting power, given at a stockholders' meeting duly called for that purpose, or when authorized by the written consent of at least a majority of the holders of the voting stock issued and outstanding, the board of directors shall have power and authority at any meeting to sell, lease or exchange all of the property and assets of this corporation, including its good-will and its corporate franchises, upon such terms and conditions as its board of directors deems expedient and for the best interest of the corporation.

This corporation may in its by-laws confer powers upon its directors in addition to the foregoing, and in addition to the powers and authorities expressly conferred upon them by statute.

VI

The capital stock of this corporation shall be Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) divided into Two Hundred Fifty (250) shares of stock of the par value of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) each. No distinction shall exist between the shares of this

corporation and all such shares shall have the same rights in the corporation.

VII

All or any portion of the capital stock may be issued for cash or in payment for real or personal property, services, or any other right or thing of value, for the uses and purposes of the corporation, and when so issued shall become and be fully paid, the same as though paid for in cash at par, and the directors shall be the sole judges of the value of any property, right or thing acquired in exchange for capital stock. Each issued and fully paid share of stock shall be non-assessable.

VIII

From time to time the capital stock may be increased according to law, and may be issued in such amounts and proportions as shall be determined by the board of directors, and as may be permitted by law.

IX

The private property of the stockholders shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatsoever.

X

Whenever the corporation shall have in effect a valid

election, neither terminated nor revoked, to be taxed pursuant to Subchapter S of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, or any amendment thereof, no attempted transfer or hypothecation, voluntary or involuntary (including any caused by the death of a stockholder), of any stock of the corporation shall be effective unless and until the proposed transferee shall have timely executed and delivered any consent or other documents required to maintain in full force and effect such election.

XI

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, being each one of the original subscribers to the capital stock hereinbefore named for the purpose of forming a corporation to do business both within and without the State of Idaho, and in pursuance of the laws of the State of Idaho, do make and file these articles of incorporation, hereby declaring and certifying that the facts herein stated are true, and we respectively agree to take the number of shares of stock hereinbefore set opposite our names and accordingly have hereunto set our hands and seals this 24th day of September, A. D., 1964.


