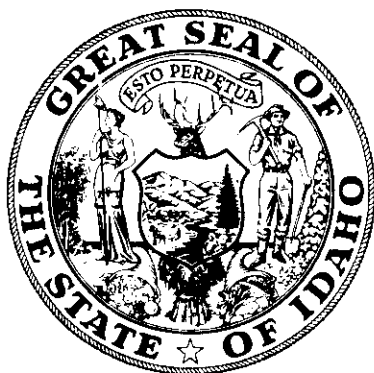

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

CREATIVE WOODCRAFTERS ASSOCIATION OF ADA COUNTY, INC.

The undersigned, acting as incorporator of a corporation under the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

FIRST

The name of the corporation is CREATIVE WOODCRAFTERS ASSOCIATION OF ADA COUNTY, INC.

SECOND

The corporation is a nonprofit corporation.

THIRD

The period of its duration is perpetual.

FOURTH

The corporation is organized for the following purposes:

- A. To acquaint those interested in woodcraftsmanship with one another.
- B. To improve woodcraft techniques through free exchange of ideas and methods, by means of oral explanation and physical demonstration, toward mutual benefit for all.
- C. To engage in craft displays.
- D. To create a purchase entity for bulk procurement of materials.
- E. To engage in equipment/material trade and exchange, and assist in the disposal of such (deceased members or otherwise).

F. To engage in any or all lawful purposes for which the corporation may be incorporated under the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act.

This corporation is organized exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by any organization exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

FIFTH

The corporation shall have members with eligibility requirements and rights of membership set forth in the by-laws.

SIXTH

The location of the initial registered office of the corporation is 300 North Sixth Street, Boise, Idaho 83702, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Dale G. Higer.

SEVENTH

The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors shall be four (4), and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve until the first annual meeting of the members and until their successors are elected and qualified are:

NINTH

The Board of Directors is expressly authorized to alter, amend and repeal the by-laws of the corporation and to adopt new by-laws, subject to repeal or change by a majority vote of the members.

TENTH

Upon the winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the organization, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation or corporation which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
