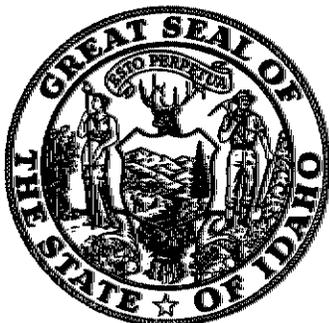

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF
JEWISH COMMUNITY CENTER CORPORATION,
A NON-PROFIT RELIGIOUS CORPORATION

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KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That the undersigned, acting as incorporators of a non-profit corporation under the Idaho Non-Profit Corporation Act and under the provision of Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation. This corporation is to succeed the former corporation known as THE JEWISH COMMUNITY CENTER CORPORATION which corporation, had its charter revoked for excusable failure to file annual statements and which corporation was subsequently dissolved by operation of law on the 31st day of December, 1993. The dissolved corporation has operated as a defacto corporation. The following Articles of Incorporation are to continue the functions of the dissolved corporation.

I.

NAME. The name of said corporation shall be JEWISH COMMUNITY CENTER CORPORATION, a non-profit religious corporation.

II.

DURATION AND NONPROFIT PURPOSE. The duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

III.

REGISTERED OFFICE. The initial registered office of the corporation shall be at 306 N. 18th, Pocatello, Idaho 83201, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is John B. Reichman, M.D.

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IV.

GENERAL PURPOSE. The general purpose of the corporation is: To promote, conduct and maintain all interests of the people of Hebrew extraction in the community in a religious, civic and material manner; to provide housing and administration for religious worship; to provide and carry out plans for rehabilitation of all people of Hebrew extraction; and, in order to properly prosecute the objects and purposes above set forth, the corporation shall have full authority to own, buy, sell, lease and otherwise convey all kinds of property, both real and personal, and securities, and to do each, all and everything necessary for the successful prosecution of the objects and purposes for which the corporation is created.

V.

LIMITATIONS.

(A) The corporation shall not possess or exercise any power of authority that will prevent it from at any time qualifying as a corporation described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, contributions to which are deductible for federal income tax purposes; nor shall it engage directly or indirectly in any activity which would cause the loss of such qualifications.

(B) No part of the activities of the corporation shall consist of engaging in propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation as these prohibited activities are defined by law.

(C) At no time shall the corporation engage in any activities which are unlawful under the laws of the State of Idaho or the laws of the United States of America.

(D) No loan shall be made by the corporation to any directors or officers of the corporation or any other person, nor shall any contributions be solicited or any gift, bequest or devise be accepted upon any condition or limitation which would cause the corporation to lose its federal income tax exemption.

(E) Upon dissolution, any assets shall be distributed only to a corporation or entity having similar non-profit objectives and asset distribution shall never accrue to the benefit of any individual or member.

VI.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The business and the affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of not more than fifteen (15), but not fewer than three (3) directors. The initial Board shall consist of nine (9) directors. The qualifications, the term of office, manner of electing directors, the number of directors to be elected, the time, place and manner of calling meetings, and the powers and duties of the directors shall be prescribed by the By-laws. The initial Board is listed below. They shall serve until the first annual meeting of the members or until successors are elected.
