ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF The Contract

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JEM MACHINE, INC.

The undersigned, GENE L. DANDLIKER and JUDY A. DANDLIKER, acting as incorporators of the above named corporation under the Idaho Business Corporation Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

I.

The name of this corporation shall be JEM MACHINE, INC.

II.

The period of existence and duration of the life of this corporation shall be perpetual.

III.

The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

To manufacture, produce, or otherwise acquire, to import, export, lease, sell, or otherwise dispose of, to alter, repair, improve, and generally deal in saws, sawmills, machinery, engines, electrical equipment and other devices of any type or character for sawing or cutting timber, logs, lumber and other forms of matter and to manufacture, renovate, repair and install any and all types of the same together with all types of apparatus of every description incidental or related to the foregoing, or any one or all of them, with all supplies and accessories pertaining thereto and to any of the foregoing, or any business related thereto or any part thereof.

To carry on the business of Brokers, Dealers and/or Financial Agents and all transaction relating to the sale, transfer or exchange of every description of lumber, timber or any type of forest products, and all transactions and negotiations on commission relating to such business; and to PAGE -1-

ATTORNEYS AT LAW SRANGEVILLE, IDAHO 63530 carry on the business of lumber brokers and brokers in all branches;

To do a general business as commission merchants, selling agents, and factor in the manner and to the same extent as natural persons could do; to buy, sell, and otherwise deal in any timber, lumber or forest products, or similiar or related thing within and without the United States.

To make and enter into all kinds of contracts, agreements and obligations by or with any person or persons, corporation or corporations, partnership or any business entity for the purchasing acquiring, holding and selling or otherwise disposing of, either as principal or agent, upon commission or otherwise, all timber, lumber and related forest products within or without the United States;

To carry on and undertake any business, undertaking, transaction or operation commonly carried on or undertaken by merchants, commission men, factors, importers, manufacturers, agents and exporters, and in the course of such business to draw, accept, endorse, acquire and sell all or any negotiable or transferable instruments and securities.

To act as agent or representative of owners or other persons or corporations having or claiming to have any interest in timber, lumber or related forest products.

To enter into, make and perform and carry out contracts of every sort and kind with any person, firm, association or corporation, municipality, body public, country, territory, district, state and government.

To purchase, hold, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock of, or any bonds, securities or evidences of indebtedness created by, any other corporation or corporations organized under the laws of PAGE -2-

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this state or any other state, country, nation or government, and while the owner thereof, to exercise all the rights, powers and privleges of ownership.

To apply for, secure, acquire by assignment, transfer, purchase or otherwise, and to exercise, carry out and enjoy any charter, license, power, authority, franchise, concessions, rights or privleges, which any government or authority or any corporation or other public body may be empowered to grant; and to pay for, aid in and contribute toward carrying the same into effect, and to appropriate any of the corporations' shares of stocks, bonds and assets to defray the necessary costs, charges and expenses thereof.

To acquire, and pay for in cash, stock or bonds of this corporation or otherwise, the good will, rights, assets and property and to undertake or assume the whole or any part of the obligations or liabilities of any person, firm, association or corporation.

To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange and other negotiable or transferable instruments.

In the purchase or acquisition of property, business, rights, or franchises, or for additional working capital, for any other object in or about its business or affairs, and without limit as to amount, incur debts and to raise, borrow and secure the payment of money in any lawful manner, including the issue and sale or other disposition of bonds, debentures, obligations, negotiable and transferable instrument and evidences of indebtedness of all kinds, whether secured by mortgage, pledge of trust or otherwise;

To acquire, manufacture, renovate, repair, install, sell, purchase, lease, equipment for recreational purposes, summer, 32 PAGE -3-

winter and for all other times of the year, of whatsoever kind and description.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the corporation capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with its business or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the corporation's property or rights.

The said corporation may perform any part of its business outside the State of Idaho, in the other states, in the District of Columbia, territories or possessions, or dependencies of the United States.

To do each and every thing necessary, suitable, useful or advisable for the accomplishment of any one or more of said objects or which shall, at any time, appear to be conducive to or expedient for the benefit of said corporation in connection therewith.

To do each and all things set forth herein to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do in the State of Idaho, and in any other state, country or place.

The foregoing clauses shall be construed as objects, purposes and powers, and it is hereby expressly provided that any enumeration of specific powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the powers of this corporation.

In general, to carry on any other business in connection with the foregoing, and to have and exercise all the powers conferred by laws of the State of Idaho upon corporations.

IV.

In furtherance, and not in limitation of the powers conferred by statute, the board of directors is expressly authorized:

To make and alter by-laws of this corporation, to fix the PAGE -4-

amount to be reserved as working capital over and above its capital stock paid in, and to authorize and cause to be executed mortgages and liens upon the real and personal property of this corporation.

If the by-laws so provided, to designate two or more of its members to constitute an executive committee, which committee shall for the time being, as provided in said resolution or in the by-laws of this corporation, have and exercise any or all of the powers of the board of directors in the management of the business and affairs of this corporation, and have power to authorize the seal of this corporation to be affixed to all papers which may require it.

Pursuant to the affirmative vote of the holders of at least a majority of the stock issued and outstanding, having voting power, given at a stockholder's meeting duly called for that purpose, or when authorized by the written consent of at least a majority of the holders of the voting stock issued and outstanding, the board of directors shall have power and authority at any meeting to sell, lease or exchange all of the property and assets of this corporation including its good will and its corporate franchises, upon such terms and conditions as its board of directors deem expedient and for the best interest of the corporation.

This corporation may in its by-laws confer powers upon its directors in addition to the foregoing, and in addition to the powers and authorities expressly conferred upon them by statute.

٧.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be ONE HUNDRED AND FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00) with the number of shares that the corporation shall have authority to issue to be FIFTEEN THOUSAND (15,000), valued at TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00)each. PAGE -5-

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No distinction shall exist between the shares of this corporation and all such shares shall have the same rights in the corporation.

VI.

All or any portion of the capital stock may be issued for cash or in payment for real or personal property, services or any other right or thing of value, for the uses and purposes of the corporation and when so issued shall become and be fully paid, the same as though paid for in cash at par; and the directors shall be the sole judges of the value of any property, right, or thing acquired in exchange for capital stock.

VII.

From time to time the capital stock may be increased according to law, and may be issued in such amounts and proportions as shall be determined by the board of directors, and as may be permitted by law.

VIII.

The private property of the stockholders shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatsoever.

IX.

The address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 901 N. Meadow, P.O. Box 108, Grangeville, Idaho 83530, and the names of its initial registered agents are Gene L. Dandliker and Judy A. Dandlicker.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors of the corporation is two(2) and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as directors until the first annual meeting of the shareholders or until their

successors are elected and shall qualify are:
