ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

A F R TUGBOATRAID

WE OF ALL MEN IN THIS STATE: That we, the undersigned, being natural persons of full age and citizens of the United States of America, in order to form a corporation for the purposes hereinafter stated, pursuant to the provisions of the laws of the State of Idaho, do hereby certify as follows:

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be A F R Incorporated.

ARTICLE II

The purposes and objects for which the corporation is formed are:

A. To conduct and carry on a general foundry and machine shop business, and to engage in the manufacture of all kinds of iron castings and machinery, and to buy iron, either manufactured or unmanufactured, and to sell the same, and any and all articles consisting or partly consisting thereof, and all products and by-products which are or may be produced, processed, or manufactured therefrom in whole or in part.

B. To manufacture and sell agricultural implements, machinery and tools and such other articles as are usually manufactured in foundries and machine shops.

C. To manufacture from any kind of metal or other material or combinations of materials, any and all kinds of castings, implements, tools, fixtures, and machinery and any other articles of commerce ordinarily made in a thoroughly accepted machine shop and foundry and the purchase and sale thereof.

4. To produce, manufacture, treat, and work in iron and other materials and products thereof in any and all forms, and to buy, sell and otherwise deal in any and all of the foregoing.

5. To erect and operate furnaces, rolling mills, forges, foundries, pipe works and all machinery, fixtures, build ings, structures and appliances that may be necessary for the conduct of its business.

6. To do a general wholesale and retail manufacturing business and to buy, sell and deal in the wholesale and retail of all kinds of manufactured and unmanufactured products.

7. To lend money and negotiate loans, either with or without security, or on the security of real or personal property; to loan, accept, endorse, buy and sell, discount and rediscount bills of exchange, notes, drafts, bonds, choses in action and securities of all kinds, both as principal and as agent; to accept as security for any loans, liens on, conditional sales of, and pledges of real and personal property.

8. To enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every sort and kind, with any person, firm, association or corporation.

9. To appoint agents, subagents and salesmen, and to enter into all necessary contracts with agents, subagents, salesmen and dealers.

10. To receive, acquire, hold, purchase, dispose of, convey, mortgage and/or lease, real and personal property; to dispose of, sell, lease, assign, transfer, mortgage and/or convey any rights, privileges, franchises, real or personal property of the corporation, other than its franchise of being a corporation, and to acquire, purchase guarantee, hold, mortgage, own, vote, sell, pledge, and/or otherwise dispose of and deal in shares, bonds, securities and debentures and other evidences of indebtedness of other corporations, domestic or foreign.

H. To enter into contracts or obligations of any type or kind essential, necessary or proper to the transaction of its ordinary affairs, or for the purposes of the corporation.

I. To acquire by purchase, or otherwise, and hold, sell, convey, encumber or transfer all kinds of real and personal property of every kind and description required in connection with the conduct of the business of the company.

J. To borrow money and otherwise incur indebtedness without limit as to amount, and to draw, take, accept, endorse, transfer, assign, guarantee, execute, and issue bonds, debentures, notes, checks, drafts, bills of exchange, negotiable instruments, and all other instruments for the payment of money, negotiable or non-negotiable, and whether secured or unsecured.

K. To conduct business in this state, or in states, District of Columbia, territories and colonies of the United States and in foreign countries, and to have one or more offices and places of business out of this state, and to acquire, receive, hold, purchase, lease, mortgag, dispose of and/or convey real or personal property situate out of this state.

L. To cause to be done, done or executed, and to procure and aid in carrying out in law, by law action, power or authorization of any business, to carry, file, recordation or corporation, domestic or foreign; to acquire real and personal property and the whole or any part of the assets, tangible or intangible, and to undertake or in any way assume the liabilities of any person, firm, association or corporation; to pay for the real and personal property, or assets in and, the whole or any part of the liabilities of the transferror; to hold or in any way assume the whole or

or any part of the property so purchased; to conduct in any lawful manner the whole or any part of any business so acquired, and to exercise all the powers necessary and expedient in and about the conduct and management of such business.

1. To apply for, purchase, receive, or in any manner to acquire, and to sell, own, use, operate and improve, and to sell, lease, assign, pledge, or in any manner dispose of, and in any manner deal with patents, patent rights, licenses, copyrights, trademarks, trade names, and to receive, own, use or in any manner dispose of any and all inventions, improvements, and processes, labels, designs, brands, or other rights, and to work, operate, or develop the same and to carry on any business, manufacturing or otherwise, which may directly or indirectly affectuate these objects or any of them.

2. To purchase, subscribe or in any manner to acquire without diminishing the capital of the corporation, except as otherwise permitted by law, and to sell, pledge and re-issue shares of its own capital stock, but such stock, so as to be sold, shall not be entitled to vote nor to receive dividends.

3. To have, exercise and enjoy all the powers now or hereafter granted to corporations organized under the laws of the State of Ohio, and particularly all of the powers and privileges granted to corporations by Chapter 1 of Title 66 of the Ohio Code, and any present and/or future amendments thereto, and to do any act or thing necessary or convenient for the transaction of the aforesaid business and/or carrying into effect any and all of the aforesaid objects and purposes.

4. All of the foregoing provisions of this Article II are to be construed both as objects and powers, and it is hereby expressly provided that the enumeration herein of specific objects and powers

shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the general powers and powers of the corporation; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to entitle or permit the corporation to carry on any business or to exercise any power or to do any act which corporations formed under the laws of Idaho now or hereafter existing may not, at the time, lawfully carry on or do. It is the intention that the purposes, objects, and powers specified in each of the paragraphs of this Article III of these Articles of Incorporation shall, except as otherwise provided, be severally limited or restricted by reference to, or inference from, the terms of each or clause or paragraph in this paragraph contained, or of any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, and it is the intention that the purposes, objects and powers specified in these Articles of Incorporation shall be regarded as independent purposes, objects and powers.

In general, to do all acts permitted by the business corporation act of Idaho, and all such other acts as may be necessary and expedient to more fully effect the objects and purposes of the corporation.

ARTICLE IV

The corporation is to have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE V

The location and postoffice address of the registered office of the corporation shall be the City of Boise, Idaho, on or near Main Street, Idaho.

ARTICLE VI

The amount of capital stock of the corporation shall be \$10,000.00, divided into 100 shares of the par value of \$100.00 per share.

The *Agrobacterium* strains were grown in the medium containing 100 mg/l of tetracycline. The cell concentration of the *Agrobacterium* suspension was adjusted to 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 600, 700, 800, 900, and 1000 cells/ml. The cell concentration of the *Agrobacterium* suspension was determined by the optical density of the suspension at 600 nm. The transformation efficiency was determined by the number of transformants per 100 cells. The data were expressed as the mean $\pm$ SD of three independent experiments.
