

The Board met this day pursuant to adjournment of April 13th, all members present.
George L. Crocker, John P. Hansen, L.E. Salladay.

Whereupon the Board ordered the COPY OF RESOLUTIONS DRAFTED AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TWIN FALLS, AND ORGANIZING THE CITY OF TWIN FALLS AS A CITY OF THE SECOND CLASS; WHICH COPY WAS DULY FILED WITH THE CLERK OF THIS BOARD ON APRIL 13TH, 1897 by the Village Clerk of the Village of Twin Falls; to be served in due time upon the Commissioners Journal, which resolutions, as shown by such copy, are as follows:

COPY OF RESOLUTIONS DISCONTINUING ORGANIZATION OF VILLAGE OF TWIN FALLS AND
ORGANIZING THE CITY OF TWIN FALLS.— AS A CITY IN THE SECOND CLASS— as passed by the
chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, Idaho, March 15th, 1907.

WHEREAS; There has been presented to the Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, a petition signed by a number of qualified electors of the said Village, and representing that said electors, having signed said petition, nominate a number equal to three fifths of the total vote of said Village;

Said petition further represents that the village of Twin Falls contains more than one thousand inhabitants, and asking to discontinue the organization as a Village and organize as a City of the second class;

Be it Resolved By the Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, That the Board has found, and does now find that the Village of Twin Falls contains more than one

That the persons signing said petition are qualified electors of said Village of Twin Falls, and that the 216 persons signing said petitions as qualified electors constitute three fifths of the total vote of the Village.

That no village election has ever been held within the village of Twin Falls,
that the above jurisdictional facts herein named, have been found by the Board of Village
Trustees upon their own investigation.

BENEFICENCE UPON THE ATTITUDE OF CERTAIN JOURNALISTS; AND FAITH, AND OPEN
THE PETITION OF THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS AS AFORESAID. IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DECLARED BY
THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF TWIN FALLS, THAT THE PETITION BE GRANTED, AND THAT
SAID VILLAGE BE AND IS HEREBY RECOGNIZED AS A VILLAGE AND THAT OVER MUNICIPAL CORPORATION
BE, AND IS HEREBY DECLARED TO BE A CITY OF THE SECOND CLASS, AND THAT THE CORPORATE NAME OF
SUCH MUNICIPALITY BE AND IS HEREBY CHANGED FROM THE "VILLAGE OF TWIN FALLS" TO THE "CITY OF
TWIN FALLS"; AND THAT THE ORGANIZATION OF THE VILLAGE IS HEREBY DISSOLVED AND IS ESTABLISHED
TO BE A CITY OF THE SECOND CLASS.

Received further, that upon the present removal and publication of said Article

The foregoing resolutions of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, being
presented to me by the Clerk of this Board, and it appearing from an examination thereof
and the certificate of the Village Clerk of said village attached thereto, that the Board
of Trustees of said village have in all matters complied with the law in the changing of
inhabitants of said village to a city of the second class.

It is hereby ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of
Twin Falls, Idaho,

That the municipal organization of Twin Falls in said County, as a Village be
and the same is hereby discontinued and that the said municipal organization be, and hereby
be reorganized to be a City of the Second Class, that the corporate name of such municipality
be and be hereby changed from the "Village of Twin Falls" to the "City of Twin Falls".

That there be hereby established and continued to the Incorporated within the
limits of Twin Falls, the City of Twin Falls, as a City of the second class, in that the
limits of said City of Twin Falls are hereby defined and described as follows:

That the Clerk of this Board attach this order to the records of the Board of Trustees of said Village as presented and copy the same upon the records of the County Commissioners of Twin Falls County, Idaho, and make an entry among the proceedings of this meeting of the Board.

Whereupon the Board considered the application of George Russell for a Liquor License, and ordered the same laid over for further consideration and for reference to the County Attorney.

Whereupon the Board considered that it be ordered to present a bill for the care of Indigent sick from Feb. last to April 1st, and that such claim be for \$26.67.

Whereupon, on motion of Mr. Belladay, the Board ordered that the compensation for the various Post Overseers be fixed at \$2.75 per day for the time actually employed in their work.

The Board having considered the matter of the care of the county Indigent sick, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that it will be to the best interest of the County to keep such Indigent sick in one place it is ordered that a contract be entered into with Mrs. Pendrum to keep such County inmates, and that the County Attorney be instructed to draw a contract covering the following terms:

\$6.00 per calendar month for Dr. G. Johnson

\$5.00 per month for James Norton

\$4.00 per month for Mrs. Pendrum

\$10.00 per month for house rent while there are three or more indigents under her care, and \$10.00 per month for house rent when the number falls below three.

Whereupon the Board ordered that this Board do not adjourn until 10 o'clock A.M. April 13th, 1907.
