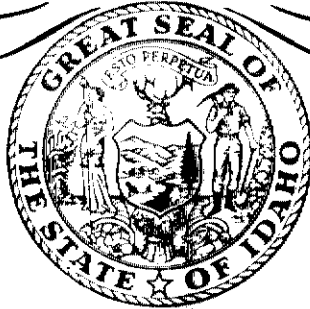


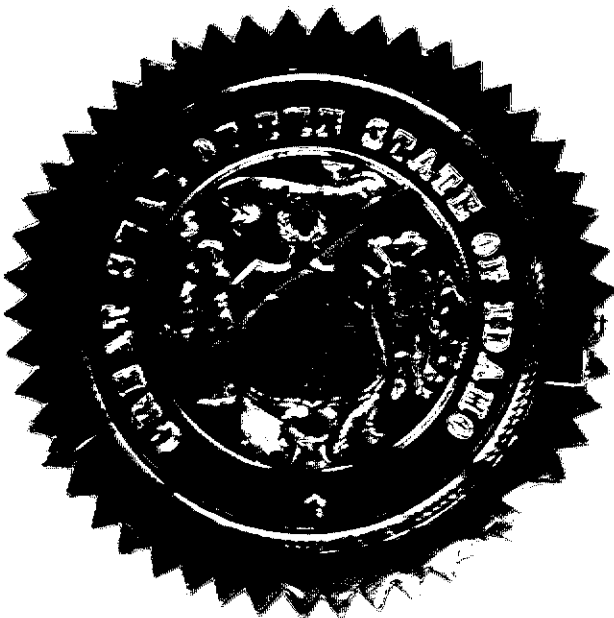

The Board met this day pursuant to adjournment of April 15th, all members being present.

George L. Creeker, John P. Hansen, L.E. Salladay.

Whereupon the Board ordered the COPY OF RESOLUTIONS DISCONTINUING THE ORGANIZATION OF THE VILLAGE OF TWIN FALLS, AND ORGANIZING THE CITY OF TWIN FALLS AS A CITY OF THE SECOND CLASS; WHICH COPY WAS DULY FILED WITH THE CLERK OF THIS BOARD ON April 13th, 1907 by the Village Clerk of the Village of Twin Falls; to be spread in full upon the Commissioners Journal, which resolutions, as shown by such copy, are as follows:

COPY OF RESOLUTIONS DISCONTINUING ORGANIZATION OF VILLAGE OF TWIN FALLS AND
ORGANIZING THE CITY OF TWIN FALLS.— AS A CITY OF THE SECOND CLASS— as passed by the
chairman and Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, Idaho, March 15th, 1907.

WHEREAS: There has been presented to the Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, a petition signed by a number of qualified electors of the said Village, and representing that said electors, having signed said petition, constitute a number equal to three fifths of the total vote of said Village;

Said petition further represents that the village of Twin Falls contains more than one thousand inhabitants, and asking to discontinue the organization as a Village and organize as a City of the second class;

Be it Resolved By the Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, That the Board has found, and does now find that the Village of Twin Falls contains more than one thousand inhabitants.

That the persons signing said petition are qualified electors of said Village of Twin Falls, and that the said persons signing said petitions as qualified electors constitute three fifths of the total vote of the Village.

That no villa or election has ever been held within the village of Twin Falls, that the above jurisdictional facts herein found, have been found by the Board of Village Trustees upon their own investigation.

WHEREFORE, Upon the findings of said Journalist and Facts, and upon the petition of the qualified electors as aforesaid, it is hereby ordered and declared by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Twin Falls, that the petition be granted, and that said Village do continue its organization as a Village and that same municipal corporation be, and is hereby declared to be a City of the Second Class, and that the corporate name of such Municipality be and is hereby changed from the "Village of Twin Falls" to the "City of Twin Falls", and that the organization as the Village is hereby discontinued and is established to be a City of the Second Class.

Resolved further, That upon the passage approval and publication of this Resolution, the Clerk of said Board, shall record this resolution in the minutes and forward one copy of the same to the Mayor of the Village of the Mayor provide for the securing of witnesses, and in the event of a trial copy of the same and only certify such copy and to deliver such copy to the Court of Sessions of the County of New York.

That there is hereby established and declared to be Incorporated within the limits of Santa Fe, the City of Santa Fe as a city of the second class; and that the same be known to all men that they may take due notice thereof, we have hereunto set our hand and seal at Santa Fe, New Mexico, this 10th day of May, A.D. 1967.

That the Clerk of this Board attach this order to the resolutions of Trustees of said Village as presented and copy the same upon the records of the Board as an entry among the proceedings of this meeting of the Board.

Whereupon the Board considered the application of George Bassett for a License, and ordered the same laid over for further consideration and for reference to the County Attorney.

Whereupon the Board ordered the Clerk to present a bill for the care of indigent sick from Feb. 1st to 1st March and that such claim be for \$26.67

Whereupon, on motion of L.E. Salladay, the Board ordered that the compensation for the various Post Overseers be fixed at \$1.75 per day for the time actually employed in road work.

The Board having considered the matter of the care of the county indigent sick, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Board that it will be to the best interest of the County to keep such indigent sick in one place it is ordered that a contract be entered into with Mrs. Pankratz to keep such county charges, and that the County Attorney be instructed to draw a contract covering the following terms:

\$25.00 per calendar month for D. G. Johnson

\$25.00 per month for James Norton

\$40.00 per month for Mrs. Pankratz

\$17.50 per month for house rent while there are three or more indigents under her care, and nothing for house rent when the number falls below three.

Whereupon the Board ordered that this Board is not adjourn until 10 o'clock A.M. April 18th, 1907
