

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF
LATOUR CREEK RAILROAD COMPANY.

We, L. S. Butler, Arthur T. Gidley, George W. Clegg,
Wm. H. Shadley, H. C. Moore, D. W. Foster & Company, or
any two or more of us, do hereby, and do, on this day,

residents of Kootenai County, Idaho, ~~and~~ on the 1st day of January,
D. C., A. D. 1887, for the purpose of forming a corporation under the

laws of the State of Idaho, do hereby make and subscribe the
following:

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION.

I.

The name of the corporation shall be the Latour Creek
Railroad Company.

II.

The purposes for which said corporation is formed are
to construct, maintain and operate a standard gauged railroad
with branches and extensions as hereinafter described, to be
operated by steam or electric power, and to transport thereon
and thereby the burdens of motion carrier of freight and passen-
gers; and for the transporting of logs, iron, coal, timber
and timber products and all other commodities and merchandise;
to exercise the right of eminent domain according to law and
to condemn and acquire rights of way over land for the con-
struction of a railroad, and for station grounds, rail yards, and

for the maintenance and operation of railroads passenger and
freight, for the uses, purposes and objects of incorporation;
and to construct, maintain and operate such other agree-
ments as may be necessary or convenient from time to time,
maintenance and operation of said railroad, engines and ex-
cavations, and the transaction of the business of a common
carrier railroad, and to acquire and hold real and personal
property.

III.

It is proposed and intended that the said railroad to
be constructed, maintained and operated, will run from a point
of connection with the railroad of the Oregon Washington Rail-
road & Navigation Company as now incorporated and located, at a
point on said railroad at or about the village of the station
of Cataldo on said railroad in Kootenai County, Idaho, in a
general north-westerly direction following the general course
of Letter Creek to a point at or near the corner between
Sections Two (2), and Three (3), Township Forty-one (41)
North, Range One (1) West, Boise Meridian, in Kootenai County,
Idaho, the estimated length of said railroad being about nine
miles; and to construct, maintain and operate any branch or
part of the railroad, as may hereinafter located and author-
ized.

IV.

The term for which and for which, the said company may
exist.

V.

The place where the principal business of said company
is to be transacted is Cataldo, Kootenai County, Idaho.

VI.

The Board of Directors shall consist of five members, at least two of whom shall be resident of the State of Idaho, and no other qualification as to residence of Directors shall be necessary; three Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and such decision of such quorum of the board shall be valid as a corporate act.

VII.

The amount of the capital stock of said corporation shall be seventy five thousand dollars, divided into 75,000 shares of the par value of one (\$1.00) dollar each.

VIII.

There has been actually subscribed of said capital stock twenty-five thousand two hundred (\$25,200) dollars being more than \$1,000.00 for each mile of said railroad, said subscriptions being as follows:

IX.

All meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at the principal office of the corporation in the state of Idaho, or at any other place or places within or without said state for the transaction of any business of the corporation as the directors may by resolution or by the by-laws provide.

X.

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in any way not conformable to the laws of the State of Idaho by vote representing at least $\frac{2}{3}$ per cent of the outstanding capital stock, at the stockholders meeting called for that purpose, as provided by section 8724 of the Revised Laws of Idaho, or in any other lawful manner.

XI.

The stockholders of this corporation shall not be individually liable for the debts of this corporation.

XII.

This corporation shall be subject to all of the duties imposed, and shall have and possess all of the powers and privileges conferred by the laws of the State of Idaho under which it is organized or which are contained in these articles of incorporation.
