Article 2, as amended shall now read:

ARTICLE 2. PURPOSE

The purpose of the Corporation is:

- A) To provide textile services and retail;
- B) To acquire, own, and/or manage both real and/or personal property,
- C) To own and/or manage interests in various business enterprises, joint ventures, corporations, partnerships, limited liability companies and projects,
 - D) To transact any and all other business (domestic or foreign);
- E) To conduct or promote any lawful business for which a Corporation may be created under Idaho Law.

Article Two previously read as follows:

ARTICLE TWO

PURPOSE OF THE CORPORATION

The nature of the business and the objects and purpose to be transacted, promoted and carried on or to do any and all of the things herein mentioned as fully and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do in any part of the world, as follows:

1. To offer the service to the general public of interior landscaping and exterior landscaping using house plants and outdoor plants. Such service shall include but not be limited to consultation, designing, caring for, and planting all manner of decorative plants.

^{2.} To purchase, to receive by way of gift, subscribe for, invest in, and in all other ways acquire, import, lease, possess, maintain, handle on consignment, own, hold for investment or otherwise use, enjoy, exercise, operate, manage, conduct, perform, make, borrow, guarantee, contract in respect of, trade and deal in, sell, exchange, let, lend, export, mortgage, pledge, deed in trust, hypothecate, encumber, transfer, assign and in all other ways dispose of, design, develop, invent, improve, equip, repair, alter,

fabricate, assemble, build, construct, operate, manufacture, plamt, cultivate, produce, market, and in all other ways (whether like or unlike any of the foregoing), deal in and with property of every kind and character, real, personal or mixed, tangible or intangible wherever situated and however held, including, but not limited to, money, credits, choses in action, securities, stocks, bonds, warrants, script, certificates, debentures, mortgage, notes, commercial paper and other obligations and evidences of interest in or indebtedness of any person, firm or corporation, foreign or domestic, or of any government or subdivision or agency thereof, documents of title, and accompanying rights, and every other kind and character of personal property, real property (improved or unimproved), and the products and avails thereof, and every character of interest therein and appurtenant thereto, including but not limited to, mineral, oil, gas and water rights, all or any part of any going business and its incidents, franchises, subsidies, charters, concessions, grants, rights, powers or privileges, granted or conferred by any government or subdivision or agency thereof, and any interest in or part of any of the foregoing, and to exercise in respect thereof all of the rights, powers, privileges, and immunities of individual owners or holders thereof.

- 3. To hire and employ agents, servants and employees, and to enter into agreements of employment and collective bargaining agreements, and to act as agent, contractor, trustee, factor, or otherwise, either alone or in company with others.
- 4. To promote or aid in any manner, financially or otherwise, any person, firm, association or corporation, and to guarantee contracts and other obligations.

- 5. To let concessions to others to do any of the things that this corporation is empowered to do, and to enter into, make, perform and carry out, contracts and arrangements of every kind and character with any person, firm, association or corporation, or any government or authority or subdivision or agency thereof.
- 6. To carry on any business whatsoever that this corporation may deem proper or convenient in connection with any of the foregoing purposes or otherwise, or that it may deem calculated, directly or indirectly, to improve the interests of the corporation and to have and to exercise all powers conferred by the laws pursuant to which and under which this corporation is formed as such laws are now in effect or may at any time hereafter be amended, and to do any and all things hereinabove set forth to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, either alone or in connection with other persons. firms, associations or corporations, and in any part of the world.

The foregoing statement of purposes shall be construed as a statement of both purposes and powers, shall be liberally construed in aid of the powers of this corporation, and the powers and purposes stated in each clause shall, except where otherwise stated, be in nowise limited or restricted by any terms of provision of any other clause, and shall be regarded not only as independent purposes, but the purposes and powers stated shall be construed distributively as each object expressed, and the enumeration as to specific powers shall not be construed as to limit in any manner the specific general powers, but are in furtherance of, and in addition to and not in limitation of said general powers.
