ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

IDAHO STATE WOMAN'S BOWLING ASSOCIATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, being natural persons of legal age and citizens of the United States and bona fide residents of the State of Idaho, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit cooperative association under Chapter 10, Title 30, of the Idaho Code, and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.

NAME

This organization shall be known as the Idaho State Woman's Bowling Association, with the location and post office address of the principal place of business being Box 406, Rexburg, Idaho, Madison County.

ARTICLE II.

OBJECT

The Idaho State Woman's Bowling Association is formed for the following objects and purposes:

Section A. To include in a central organization all qualified WIBC members in the State of Idaho, and any adjacent territory designated by WIBC, except that portion North of the Washington-Oregon boundary line. It shall be subsidiary to the Woman's International Bowling Congress, which is the parent body, and the provisions of these Articles of Incorporation shall govern the organization subject to the Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws, rules and regulations of the WIBC.

Section B. To fulfill the duties of state associations as required by WIBC.

Section C. To maintain and increase interest in the bowling game, and to have and exercise a general care and

supervision over those related activities initiated by and/or conducted by the state association, as permitted by the WIBC.

Section D. To conduct an annual association tournament to determine its champions.

Section E. To conduct this association as a nonprofit organization.

Section F. To aid the WIBC in organizing city associations and to serve in performing counseling service to its members.

Section G. The Certificate of Association, issued by the Woman's International Bowling Congress to this association, establishes its right to operate as a subsidiary group of the WIBC.

ARTICLE III.

MEMBERSHIP

Section A. Membership of the Idaho State Woman's Bowling Association shall be composed of individual woman bowlers who are members of the WIBC. The rights and interests of all members shall be equal, and no member can have or acquire a greater interest therein than any other member.

Section B. Qualifications for membership, requirements of members, transfer of membership, involuntary suspension of members, and such other regulations as to membership as are considered necessary or expedient are or may be provided for in the By-Laws.

ARTICLE IV.

Officers & Election

Section A. The executive board shall include a president, 1st and 2nd vice presidents, secretary, treasurer, sergeant-at-arms and 32 directors. All officers, directors, delegate and alternate to WIBC annual meeting are to be elected by ballot of the voting members at the annual meeting.

Section B. The duties of officers and directors and such other regulations and prohibitions regarding the qualification of officers as may be deemed necessary or expedient are or may be provided for in the By-Laws.

Section C. The property and business of the Idaho State Woman's Bowling Association shall be managed by an executive board which may exercise all the powers granted in its effort to realize the objects of this organization, subject to the conformance with the Articles of Incorporation, By-Laws, rules and regulations of the WIBC, and the decision of its members.

ARTICLE V.

MEETINGS

Section A. The time and place of annual and other meetings, the notices to members announcing meetings, and the business of the meetings and such other regulations as are considered necessary or expedient are or may be provided for in the By-Laws. The corporation is to have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE VI.

AMENDMENTS

Section A. The By-Laws of this association may be altered, amended or new By-Laws adopted at any regular meeting or special meeting of the members thereof called for that purpose by the affirmative vote of 2/3 of the members present at such meeting provided, that a quorum as specified in the By-Laws of the association or the laws of the State of Idaho, be present. All proposed amendments to the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of the state association shall be submitted in writing by the proposer to the association secretary and the legislative committee of the state association by sixty (60) days (date to be set by delegates, i.e., the voting body of the state association meeting), prior to the annual state meeting.

These proposed amendments shall be mailed thirty (30) days in advance to the state executive board members for consideration in an executive board meeting prior to the annual meeting, and to delegate to consider in a delegates' meeting prior to the annual meeting.

Section B. Unless otherwise specified in the proposed change, all changes to the Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws shall become effective on August 1st, following their adoption.

Section C. Changes approved at the WIBC Annual Meeting which apply to the state Articles of Incorporation and By-Laws shall be made automatically without further action.
