

M. C. SEAGRAVE, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

That at all the times herein mentioned he was a Director of the **WESTERN MICA COMPANY**, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California; that said corporation did not pay the license tax/for the year 1909 to the State of California required by "An act relating to revenue and taxation, providing for a license tax upon corporations, and making an appropriation for the purpose of carrying out the objects of this act" which became a law of the State of California by approval of the Governor March 20th, 1905; that thereafter, on or before the 15th day of September, 1909 said corporation was by proclamation of the Governor declared delinquent and at 4 o'clock P. M. on the 30th day of November, 1909, under and by virtue of the provisions of said act, the Charter of said **WESTERN MICA COMPANY** was forfeited to the State of California, and at said time said **WESTERN MICA COMPANY** ceased to exist as a corporation, and ever since has not been and is not now a corporation or authorized to do business as a corporation.
