ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

of

SHOSHONE TITLE COMPANY

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we, the undersigned, being natural persons of full age and citizens of the United States, in order to form a corporation for the purposes hereinafter stated, under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 9, Title 30, Idaho Code, of the State of Idaho and the acts amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto, do hereby certify as follows:

FIRST

The name of the corporation is "SHOSHONE TITLE COMPANY".

SECOND

The purposes and objects for which the corporation is formed are:

- (a) To furnish abstracts of title to real estate; as an agent of a qualified title insurance company to guarantee the title, and to make insurance of every kind pertaining to or connected with titles to real estate, and to make, execute and perfect such and so many contracts, agreements, policies and other instruments as may be required therefor.
- (b) To act as assignee, receiver, guardian, executor, administrator, and the president or secretary of any such company may take the oath necessary to qualify it to act in such capacity, and such company shall be bound thereby.
- (c) To act as fiscal or transfer agent of any state, municipality, body politic or corporation, and in such capacity to receive and distribute money, transfer, register and countersign certificates of stock, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness, and to receive and manage any sinking fund thereon on such terms as may be agreed upon.
- (d) To take, receive and hold any and all such pieces of real property as may have been or may hereafter be the subject of any insurance made by such companies under the powers conferred by their charter, and the same to grant, bargain, sell, convey and dispose of in any such manner as they see proper.
- (e) To act as escrow agent and escrow holder and to purchase and sell real estate and take charge of the same.
- (f) To become security for the payment of all damages that may be assessed and directed to be paid for lands taken in the building of any railway, or for the purposes of any railway, or for the opening of streets or roads or for any purpose whatsoever where land or property is authorized by law to be taken.
- (g) To become security upon any writ of error or appeal, or in any proceeding instituted in any court in this state, in which security may be required.

(h) To buy, sell, acquire, hold, own, mortgage, pledge, lease, assign, transfer, trade and deal in and with all kinds of personal property, goods, wares and merchandise of every kind, nature and description;

(i) To buy, sell, lease, let, mortgage, exchange or otherwise acquire or dispose of lands, lots, houses, buildings and real property, hereditaments and appurtenances of all kinds and wheresoever situated, and of any interest and rights therein, to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and without limit as to amount;

(j) To acquire by purchase, subscription, or otherwise, and to own, hold, sell, negotiate, assign, deal in, exchange, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of, any shares of capital stock, scrip, bonds, mortgages, securities, or evidences of indebtedness, issued or created by any other corporation, joint stock company or association, public or private, or by whomsoever issued, and while the holder or owner thereof to possess and exercise in respect thereof any and all rights, powers and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon;

(k) To make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and description made for any lawful purposes, without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association or corporation, either public or private, or with any territory or government, or any agency thereof;

(l) To borrow money, to draw, make, accept, endorse, transfer, assign, execute and issue bonds, debentures, promissory notes, and other evidences of indebtedness, and for the purpose of securing any of its obligations or contracts to convey, transfer, assign, deliver, mortgage and/or pledge all or any part of the property or assets, real or personal at any time owned or held by this corporation, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Directors shall authorize, and as may be permitted by law;

(m) To acquire, hold, sell, re-issue, or cancel any shares of its own capital stock, provided, however, that this corporation may not use any of its funds or property for the purchase of its own common stock when such use would cause any impairment of the capital of this corporation, and provided, further, that the shares of its own capital stock belonging to this corporation shall not be voted directly or indirectly;

(n) To purchase or otherwise acquire the whole or any part of the property, assets, business and good-will of any other person, firm, corporation or association, and to conduct in any lawful manner the business so acquired, and to exercise all the powers necessary or convenient in and about the conduct, management and carrying on of such business;

(o) To organize, incorporate and re-organize subsidiary corporations and joint stock companies and associations for any purpose permitted by law;

(p) To have one or more offices to carry on all or any part of its operation and business, and to do all and everything necessary, suitable, convenient or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein named, or which shall at any time appear

conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the corporation, and which now or hereafter may be authorized by law, and this to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, or otherwise, and either alone or in connection with any person, firm, association or corporation;

(q) To have and to exercise any and all powers and privileges now or hereafter conferred by the laws of the State of Idaho upon corporations formed under the general corporation laws of said State, or under any Act amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto or substituted therefor;

The foregoing clauses are to be construed both as objects and powers; and it is hereby expressly provided that enumeration herein of specific objects and powers shall not be held to limit or restrict in any manner the general powers of the corporation; provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall be deemed to authorize or permit the corporation to carry on any business or to exercise any power or to do any act which a corporation formed under the Act hereinbefore referred to, or any amendment thereof or supplement thereto, or substitute therefor, may not at the time lawfully carry on or do. It is the intention that the purposes, objects and powers specified in each of the subparagraphs (a) to (q) inclusive, of paragraph Second of these Articles of Incorporation, shall, except as otherwise expressly provided, in no wise be limited or restricted by reference to, or inference from, the terms of any other subparagraph, clause or paragraph of these Articles of Incorporation.

THIRD

The corporation is to have perpetual existence.

FOURTH

The location and postoffice address of the registered office of the corporation is P. O. Box 2840, Boise, Ada County, Idaho.

FIFTH

The amount of the capital stock of this corporation shall be, and is \$25,000.00 divided into 250 shares of the par value of \$100 per share.

SIXTH

The names and postoffice addresses of the incorporators, and the number of shares subscribed for by each, are as follows:

SEVENTH

The private property of the stockholders of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent whatsoever, and the shares of the corporation shall not be subject to assessment for the purpose of paying expenses, conducting business, or paying debts of the corporation.

EIGHTH

The number of Directors of the corporation shall be as specified in the By-Laws, and such number may from time to time be increased or decreased in such manner as may be prescribed in the By-Laws, provided the number of directors of the Corporation shall not be less than three. In case of any increase in the number of Directors, the additional Directors may be elected by the Directors then in office, and the Directors so elected shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the stockholders and until their successors are elected and qualified.

NINTH

Stockholders of the corporation shall have pre-emptive and preferential right of subscription to any shares of stock of the corporation, whether now or hereafter authorized, or to any obligations convertible into stock of the corporation, issued, or sold, and the Board of Directors, in issuing stock of the corporation, or obligations convertible into stock, shall first offer such issue of stock or obligations to the stockholders of the corporation.

TENTH

A voluntary sale, lease or exchange of all of the property and assets of the corporation, including its goodwill and its corporate franchises, may be made by the Board of Directors upon such terms and conditions as it may deem expedient and for the best interests of the corporation.

ELEVENTH

No contract or other transaction between the corporation and any other corporation and no act of the corporation shall in any way be affected or invalidated by the fact that any of the Directors of the corporation are pecuniarily or otherwise interested in, or are Directors or officers of, such other corporation; any Director individually, or any firm of which any Director may be a member, may be a party to, or may be pecuniarily or otherwise interested in, any contract or transaction of the corporation, provided that the fact that he or such firm is so interested shall be disclosed or shall have been known to the Board of directors or a majority thereof; and any Director of the corporation who is also a Director or officer of such other corporation, or who is so interested may be counted in determining the existence of a quorum at any meeting of the Board of Directors of the corporation which shall authorize any such contract or transaction with like force and effect as if he were not such director or officer of such other corporation or not so interested.

TWELFTH

The Board of Directors is expressly authorized to repeal and amend the By-Laws of the corporation and to adopt new By-Laws, and the corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provision contained in these Articles of Incorporation, in the manner now, or hereafter, prescribed by law, by a majority vote of the shareholders, represented in person or by proxy, at any annual meeting of the shareholders or at any meeting duly called for that purpose, except where the laws of the State of Idaho otherwise provide.
