

Statement for Organization

OF SNARE RIVER LUMBER COMPANY.

We, the undersigned G.E. Boverman, Henry H. Antwin and James H. Stearns, do hereby certify that we have associated ourselves to form a corporation, under the laws of the State of Wyoming, as follows, to wit:

The name of the corporation shall be SNARE RIVER LUMBER COMPANY.

The object of the corporation shall be the manufacture, purchase and sale of lumber, lath, shingles, building material, mouldings, fuel, etc.,

The amount of the capital stock shall be forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000).

The capital stock shall be divided into four hundred and fifty shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each.

The term of existence of said corporation shall be fifty years.

The number of trustees who shall manage the affairs of the corporation shall be three; they must all be stockholders in the company. The trustees who shall manage the affairs of the company for the first year shall be, G.E. Boverman, Henry H. Antwin and James H. Stearns.

The trustees shall have power to make by-laws for the management of the business affairs of the company, prescribing the duties of the officers and regulating its business methods.

The principal part of the business of the company within the State of Wyoming shall be in the city of Granger, County of Uinta, in the State of Wyoming. Part of the business of said company will be carried on outside said State of Wyoming.
