CERTIFICATE OF AMENDMENT TO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF ST. PAUL MEMORIAL CHURCH.

MNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that at a regular meeting of the members of the St. Paul Memorial Church, an Idaho religious corporation, of Coeur d' Alene, Idaho, held at the said church building in Goeur d' Alene, Idaho, at 7 o'clock P.M., on the 14th day of July, 1964, pursuant to a notice given by publication for four consecutive weeks in the Goeur d' Alene Press, a legal newspaper published at Goeur d' Alene, Kootenai County, Idaho, the City where said meeting was held, and by posting a like notice in a conspicuous place in said church building where the meeting was held for a similar length of time, which notice stated the time and place of holding such meeting and the manner in which it was intended to amend and supplement the Articles of Incorporation, by a motion duly made, seconded and unanimously adopted, the said Articles of Incorporation were amended and supplemented by adding thereto an Article VII, reading as follows, to-wit:

## "Article VII.

That the property and assets of this corporation are irrevocably dedicated to religious, charitable, philanthropic and educational purposes, and in the event of liquidation, dissolution or abandonment of this corporation for any reason, the same or any part thereof shall not inure to the benefit of any private person, but that any residue of assets remaining after payment of this corporation's indebtedness and expenses upon dissolution, shall be paid over absolutely to the Hundred Nations Crusade, 241 Main Street, Wabash, Indiana, and The Evangelical Alliance Mission, 2845 W. McLean Avenue, Chicago 47, Illinois, in equal shares, provided each thereof is an exempt

organization within the meaning of the U.S. Internal Revenue Laws, or if only thereof be so exempt, then all of said residue shall be paid to the one so exempt. If both of said organizations are non-exempt, or have ceased to exist, or the survivor thereof is non-exempt at the time this corporation is dissolved, then, in any such residue shall be paid over absolutely to such exempt organization as the trustees of this corporation may at that time, in their discretion, designate."

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the chairman and secretary of the Board of Trustees of said corporation have hereunto set their hands on this 17th day of July, 1964, at Coeur d' Alene, Idaho.
