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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

7		answer Him, "Lord, when did we see You hungry, and feed You, or
8		thirsty, and give You something to drink? And when did we see You
9		a stranger, and invite You in, or naked, and clothe You? When did
10		we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?" The King will
11		answer and say to them, 'Truly I say to you, to the extent that you
12		did it to one of these brothers of Mine, even the least of them, you
13		did it to Me." We purpose through the gospel of Jesus Christ and

1 2	Article VII. (Polity)		
3	This ministry is non-denominational. We do not align ourselves with any organization		
4	or association structured by men, but adheres to the truths set forth in God's written		
5	word, the Holy Bible. This ministry is, therefore, autonomous and independent of		
6	ecclesiastical control. We accept the freedom and responsibility of the individual, the		
7	right of private judgment in conjunction with God's divine will. We hold to the		
8	separation of church and state. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation		
9	shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence		
10	legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the		
11	publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any		
12	candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this		
13	Corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or		
14	exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this Corporation as		
15	set forth in Article IV hereof.

17	(Articles of Faith)		
8	As a ministry of Jesus Christ, this Corporation accepts the Bible as the revealed will o		
19	God, that which is the all-sufficient rule of faith and practice, yet, for the purpose of		
20	maintaining unity, harmony and understanding, the following statement of basic Truth

b. Our Godhead - Our God is revealed to us as Triune Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Our God is infinite, eternal, unchangeable and holy in nature, attributes and purpose. Our Salvation We believe that, owing to universal spiritual death through sin, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless "born from above" and that no degree of reformation however great, no attainments in morality however high, no culture however attractive, no water baptism or other ordinance however administered, but a new nature imparted from God, a new life implanted by the Holy Spirit through The Word, is absolutely essential to salvation. We believe, also, that our redemption has been accomplished solely by the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, who was made to be sin and was made a curse for us, dying in our place; and that no repentance, no feeling, no good resolutions, no sincere efforts, no submission to rules and regulations of any church, or all the churches that have existed since the days of the Apostles, can add in the very least degree to the value of His shed blood, or to the merit of the finished work wrought for us by Him. 9		to Him and one with Him forever. We also believe that if a person has
10		truly "been saved" (present tense) he has the assurance that he "shall be
11		saved" (future tense). By this we mean that it is our belief that the
12		individual who has been saved from the penalty of sin will be given
13		evidence that He who has begun a good work in us will surely bring it to
14		completion on the other side of the grave when He saves us even from the
15		presence of sin. Those who say they have no sin in this life deceive

19	g.	<u>Doctrines of the Cross</u> - We believe that the cross is the place where our

23		(transferred) to us and our unrighteousness was imputed to Him.

righteous God, thereby allowing God's love to reach us through

Justification - Through Jesus Christ we become •right' with God 1 2 (Justifies - just as if I'd never sinned), to be once again in a 3 harmonious state with God the creator. Our Comforter - We believe that the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the 21 Trinity, who is God and very God, though omnipresent with the Father and 22 the Son from all eternity, took up His abode in the world in a special sense on the day of Pentecost according to the divine promise, dwells in every 23 believer, and by His baptism places the believer in Christ at the same 24 instant that, through regeneration, He places all acceptable worship and 25 service; and that He never takes His departure from believers who make 26 up the Body of Christ, but is ever present to testify of Christ; seeking to 27 28 occupy believers with Him and not with themselves nor with their

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j. Our Christian Walk - We believe that we Christians are called with a holy calling, to walk, not after the flesh, but after the Spirit, and so to live in the power of the indwelling Spirit that we will not fulfill the lust of the flesh, but the flesh with its fallen Adamic nature, which in this life is never eradicated, being with us to the end of our earthly pilgrimage, needs to be kept by the Spirit constantly in subjection to Christ, or it will surely manifest its presence in our lives to the dishonor of Our Lord. Rom. 6:11-13, 7:2, 4, 12-13; Gal. 5:16-23; Eph. 4:22-24; Col. 2:1-10; I Peter 1:14-16; I John 1:4-7, 3:5-9; Rom. 7:14-25.

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Our Christian Service - We believe the divine, enabling gifts, for service are bestowed by the Spirit upon all who are saved. While there is diversity of gifts, each believer is energized by the same Spirit, and each is called to his own divinely appointed service as the Spirit may will. In the apostolic church there were certain gifted men who were appointed by God for the perfecting of the saints. We believe also that today some men are especially called by God and that it is the fulfilling of His will and to His eternal glory that the church shall sustain and encourage these in their service for God. Rom. 12:6; I Cor. 12:4-11; Eph. 4:11. We believe that wholly apart from salvation benefits, which are bestowed equally upon all who believe, rewards are promised according to the faithfulness of each believer in his service for the Lord, and that these rewards will be bestowed at the judgment seat of Christ after He comes to receive His own to Himself. Our Mission - We believe that it is the explicit message of our Lord Jesus Christ to those whom He has saved that they should go forth into the world at His direction, even as He was sent forth into the world by His Father. We believe that, after we are saved we are divinely reckoned to be related to this world as strangers and pilgrims, ambassadors and witnesses, and that our primary purpose in life should be to make Christ known to all men everywhere. m.	Our Hope - We believe that, according to the Word of God, the next great

	this event is the blessed hope set before us in the Scripture, and for this

The Church - We believe that all who are united to the risen and ascended Son of God are members of that living organism, Scripturally identified as the true church, as contrasted with those earthly organizations (or denominations) which contain unbelievers as well as saints. We believe that membership or non-membership in the organized churches of the earth has nothing to do with the salvation of the believer who is placed in the true church, the Body of Christ, by the baptism of the Spirit. We believe that having become members one of another by this act of the Spirit of God, we are solemnly obligated to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace, rising above all sectarian and denominational differences, and loving one another with a pure heart fervently. We further believe that all who are united to the risen and ascended Christ, as Christians, are built up into a spiritual house, a chosen people, a holy royal priesthood able to minister to one another. Matt. 16:16-18; I Thes. 2:14; John 17:12-24; Eph. 4:3-5; I Peter 2:5, 9; I Peter 1:22.

It was Augustine, the early Christian church father, who said: "In essentials unity, in non-essentials liberty, and in all things charity". We, as an evangelical ministry, see great merit and wisdom in such an approach before our God and Savior. In view of this, we the directors of this corporation, accept these fourteen basic Articles of Faith as the essentials for unity. We allow each other the liberty of the non-essentials and in all things we commit ourselves to charity toward one another and those outside our corporation.

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1	Article IX.
2	(Property)

The corporation may in its corporate name, sue, or be sued, acquire by purchase, gift, devise, bequest or otherwise; and own, hold, invest, reinvest or dispose of property, both real and personal for such work as the ministry may undertake, and may purchase, own, receive, hold, manage, care for, and transfer, rent, lease, mortgage, or otherwise encumber, sell assign, transfer, and convey such property for the general purpose of the ministry. It may receive and hold in trust, both real and personal property, and invest and reinvest the same, make contracts for promoting the objects and purposes of the ministry.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its directors or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article IV hereof.

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, or scientific purposes and shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the District Court of the County in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

Article X (Provision for Bylaws)

1	This corporation shall be governed	d by a duly adopted code of bylaws, which		
2	bylaws shall not be inconsistent with these Articles of Incorporation or inconsistent			
3	with the Laws of the State of Idaho. The meetings of the directors of the corporation			
4	shall be held and the bylaws shall be adopted in accordance with the provisions of the			
5	laws of the State of Idaho subsequent	to the issuance by the Secretary of State of the		
6	Certificate of Incorporation.
