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ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO THE ARTICLES OF INCORPO

OF

OIKONOMIA, INC.

Pursuant to the provisions of Idaho Code § 30-3-91, the fundersigned Corporation adopts the following Articles of Amendment to its Articles of Incorporation:

- 1. The name of the Corporation is Oikonomia, Inc. The address of the Corporation is 6258 N. 400 E., Bliss, Idaho, 83314. Linda I. Hesthag is the sole member of the Corporation and the sole member entitled to vote and that she voted unanimously in favor of the Articles of Amendment set out hereinbelow.
- 2. The following amendment to the Articles of Incorporation was adopted by the Members of the Corporation on the 24th day of February, 1997, in the manner prescribed by Idaho Code § 30-3-91:

Article IV on page 1 of the Articles of Incorporation for Oikonomia, Inc. is hereby amended to read by this Amendment filed as indicated hereinbelow, which states:

ARTICLE IV

PURPOSES AND POWERS OF ASSOCIATION

This Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a Corporation exempt from Federal

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income tax described in section 501(c)3) of the Internal Revenue Code (or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

1. Educate resource managers and environmentalists to be attentive to the

ecosystem and to manage for ecological, economic and social sustainability;

Educate individuals to understand natural systems and the productive cycle of

land. Open dialogue between resource managers and environmentalists;

3. Conduct training and educational programs in the principles and practical

application of holistic management as it relates to businesses, communities (rural and urban),

rangelands, woodlands and wildlife;

4. Develop models for sustainable land use. Develop hands-on learning processes

to facilitate responsible resource management;

5. Sponsor public workshops to support individuals, groups and communities in

working together to achieve common goals;

6. To encourage and stimulate local communities in the documentation of all

phases of land and other environmental management;

Support local communities to achieve collective goals.

In addition, the Corporation shall have and be allowed to exercise any and all powers,

rights and privileges which a Corporation organized under the Non-profit Corporation Laws of the

State of Idaho may now or hereafter have or exercise.
