## ***Article 2 Purpose***

***ICAPS is organized to preserve cultural arts and to promote awareness through fellowship and communication among people who participate or support the areas of performing arts, literary, media, entertainment and shall be operated exclusively for educational and cultural preservation.***

***ICAPS may carry out its purposes directly or by making distributions to other organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.***

## ***Article 8 Dissolution***

***Upon the dissolution of the ICAPS, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the ICAPS, distribute the assets of the ICAPS for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court in the county in which the registered office of the ICAPS is then located, to such organization or organizations as said Court shall determine.***
