## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

We, the undersigned, residents of Idaho, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho adopt the following articles of incorporation for such corporation:

- 3. To manufacture, purchase or otherwise acquire, own, mortgage, pledge, sell, assign, and transfer, or otherwise dispose of, invest, trade, deal in and deal with goods, wares and merchandise and real and personal property of every class and description;
- 4. To engage in any commercial, industrial, and/or agricultural enterprise calculated or designed to be profitable to this corporation and in conformity with the laws of the states in which business is transacted:
- 5. To generally engage in, do, and perform any enterprise, act, or vocation that a natural person might or could do or perform;
- 6. To become a member of any partnership or joint venture and to enter into any lawful arrangement for sharing profits and/or losses in any transaction(s), to promote and organize other corporations;
- 7. To do business anywhere in the world;
- 8. To have and to exercise all rights and powers that are now or may hereafter be granted to a corporation by law;
- 9. To acquire, hold, lease, encumber, convey, or otherwise dispose of real and personal property within or without the state, and take real and personal property by will, gift, or bequest;
- 10. To borrow money and issue bonds, debentures, notes and evidences of indebtedness, and secure the payment of performance of its obligations by mortgage or otherwise;
- 11. To acquire, subscribe for, hold, own, pledge, and otherwise dispose of and represent shares of stock, bonds, and securities of any other corporation, domestic or foreign;
- 12. To purchase or otherwise acquire its own bonds, debentures, or other evidences of its indebtedness or obligation, and, subject to the provisions of the corporations laws of the State of Idaho and Federal securities laws, purchase or otherwise acquire its own shares;
- 13. Subject to the provisions of the Articles, to redeem shares thereby made subject to redemption;
