CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

IRAH. MASTERS
I, J. D. (CITY) PRICE, Secretary of State of the State of Idaho, and legal custodian of the corporation records of the State of Idaho, do hereby certify that the original of the articles of incorporation of MERIDIAN POST NO. 4000,
VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES, INCORPORATED
was filed in the office of the Secretary of State on the seventh day
of April A. D. One Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty-two and
is duly recorded on Film No. 74 of Record of Domestic Corporations of the State of Idaho,
and that the said articles contain the statement of facts required by Sections 29-103, 29-1101 and
29-1102, Idaho Code, Annotated.

AND I FURTHER CERTIFY, That the persons executing the articles and their associates
and successors are hereby constituted a corporation, by the name stated in the articles, and for
perpetual existence from the date hereof, with its registered office in this State located
at Meridian in the County of Ada,
and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Religious, Ex-Service
Men, Benevolent, Charitable and Fraternal Corporations, as provided in Chapter 11, Title 29,
Idaho Code, Annotated.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION AND CHARTER OF
MERIDIAN POST NO. 4000
VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION ENTERED into on this 18th day of
March A.D. 1952, by and between the undersigned sub-
scribers, all citizens of Idaho who hereby associate themselves
together as a body politic under the laws of the State of Idaho, as
a corporation not for profit, and they adopt the following proposed
charter.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation shall be Meridian Post No. 4000,
VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES, INCORPORATED, and
the same shall be located in such place or places in the City of
Meridian, County of Ada, as provided by the board of Directors and
designated by the members of said corporation, but the temporary
address of said corporation shall be Ada County, Idaho.

ARTICLE II

The general nature and purpose of the corporation shall be:

- (1) Fraternal, patriotic, historical and educational; to pre-
serve and strengthen comradeship among its members; to
assist worthy comrades; to perpetuate the memory and his-
tory of our dead, and to assist their widows and orphans;
to maintain true allegiance to the Government of the United
States of America and fidelity to its Constitution and laws;
to foster true patriotism; to maintain and extend the insti-
tution of American Freedom; and to preserve and defend the
United States from all her enemies, whomsoever.
- (2) To purchase, sell, transfer, mortgage and lease or rent
real and personal property and do all things necessary
and essential thereto,
- (3) To do all things necessary and essential to carry on the
activities, rehabilitation, welfare and social work of the
Post, including the establishment and operation of recrea-

tion rooms and club facilities for the use and comfort of the members and Auxiliary.

The said Meridian Post No. 4000, VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES, INCORPORATION, shall at all times remain under the jurisdiction of and be governed according to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, and in the event any provision of these By-Laws or of this certificate of Incorporation conflicts with the National Constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, such conflicting provisions shall be deemed null and void, and the National Constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States will determine the purpose and objectives of said corporation

ARTICLE III

The Qualifications of the members and the manner of their admission into this corporation not for profit shall be as follows:

No person shall be a member of this corporation unless he has served honorably as an officer or enlisted man in the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States of America in any foreign war, insurrection, or expedition, which service shall be recognized as campaign medal service and governed by the authorization of the award of a campaign badge by the Government of the United States of America. The active and voting membership of this corporation shall at all times be confined to the active membership in good standing in Meridian Post No. 4000, VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES with eligibility to, acquiring of, suspension from and discontinuance of membership being in accordance with the National Constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

ARTICLE IV

This corporation, not for profit, shall have perpetual existence subject to the provisions of the laws of the state, and the Constitu-

tion and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

ARTICLE V
Officers

Section 1: The officers of this corporation (sometimes referred "Directors and/or "Trustees"), their nomination, election or appointment, installation, power and authority shall be in accordance with the provisions of the National By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Section 2: The number of officers (Directors) of this corporation shall be the number as provided for a Post of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States by the National By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

Section 3: The names and addresses of the present persons who are to act in the capacity of principal officers (Directors) until the selection of their successors are as follows:

ARTICLE VI

All assets of this corporation shall be and remain assets of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and shall be used, spent, and distributed in accordance with the National Charter, Constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. In the event of a dissolution of this corporation all its assets shall be the property of Meridian Post No. 4000, VETERANS OF FOREIGN WARS OF THE UNITED STATES: and, in the event of the simultaneous dissolution of this corporation and of the forfeiture of the charter issued by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, to be disposed of in accordance with the National By-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the said Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. At no time shall the assets of this corporation be distributed or divided among its individual members thereof.

ARTICLE VII

This corporation, not for profits, shall have the following general powers:

To have perpetual succession with power to sue and be sued in courts of law and equity; to receive, hold, own, use and dispose of such real estate, personal property, money, contract, rights and privileges as shall be deemed necessary and incidental for its corporate purposes; to adopt, amend, apply and administer By-Laws and regulations to carry out its purposes, not inconsistent with the laws of the United States ~~or~~ any State; and such other powers as are not inconsistent or in conflict with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. The corporation shall not purchase, sell or mortgage any real estate without notice therefor to the members of the corporation, at a regular or special meeting called for said purpose, and by a vote of approval of a majority of those members present at such regular or special meeting called for such purpose.

Should any conflict arise between the provisions of this charter and the provisions of the Constitution and By-Laws of the

Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, said conflicting provisions of this charter shall be deemed null and void and shall not be effective until approved by the Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.

ARTICLE VIII

The right to repeal, alter or amend this charter at any time is hereby expressly reserved, but any alteration, modification, or amendment made to this charter shall be governed by the constitution and By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and not in conflict therewith, and no amendment, modification, or alteration shall be made which will in any way conflict with the provisions of the National By-Laws of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, nor shall any change whatsoever be effective until the same has been approved by the Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.


