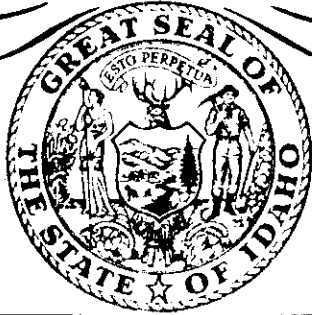

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ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF IDAHO COUNTY, IDAHO, CREATING THE VILLAGE OF WHITE BIRD, IDAHO, DESIGNATING THE METES AND BOUNDS THEREOF AND APPOINTING FIVE QUALIFIED PERSONS AS TRUSTEES.

A petition having been presented to the Board of Commissioners of Idaho County, Idaho, on the 14th day of August, 1956 for the creation of the Village to be known as WHITE BIRD, Idaho, and defining the metes and bounds thereof, and it appearing from the petition, the records, maps, files and oral evidence presented to the Board of County Commissioners that a majority of the taxable inhabitants of the proposed village have signed such petition and that inhabitants to the number of 125 or more are actual residents of the territory described in the petition, and it appearing that the petition, records and files are in proper order and that all things required to be done have been done, and the Board being satisfied that a majority of the taxable inhabitants of the proposed village have signed such petition and that inhabitants of the number of 125 or more are actual residents of the territory described in the petition;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners does hereby declare that the said proposed village of WHITE BIRD, Idaho, be, and the same is hereby incorporated; the Clerk is directed to enter this order of incorporation upon the records of the County of Idaho, Idaho; that the metes and bounds description of said village are as follows:

Commencing at the corner common to Section 14, 15, 22 and 23, Township 28 North, Range 1 E.B.M. and running North 31°50' east 545.8 feet to the SW corner of Block D; thence in a northerly direction along the Western Boundary of said Block D to the NW corner of said Block D; thence in a northerly direction across Cooper Street to the SW corner of Block C; thence along the western boundary of said Block C across an alley to the NW corner of said Block C; thence in an Easterly direction along the northern boundary of said Block C to the NE corner of said Block C; thence diagonally across Bridge Street to a point that is the SW corner of Block A of the original Town of White Bird; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary of said Block A to the NW corner of said Block A; thence in a southeasterly direction along the northern boundary of said Block A to a point which is the NW corner of Lot 2 of said Block A; thence on a line north 19°54' east parallel to the western boundary of Fenn's Addition to a point that is due west of the NW corner of said Fenn's Addition; thence in an easterly direction a distance of 17.3 feet to the NW corner of Fenn's

 22 of Tracts B and A of the said Everest's Addition to the SE corner of the said
 23 Everest's Addition, which is also the SE corner of the said Tract A; thence
 24 in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of the said Tract A to

 26 thence in a southerly direction along the eastern boundary line of the said

 36 thence at right angles in a southwesterly direction across an alley to the
 37 NE corner of Lot 12, of Block B; thence in a southwesterly direction along
 38 the eastern boundary of the said Lot 2 to the SE corner of the said Lot 12;
 39 thence in a southwesterly direction across Cooper Street to a point which
 40 is the NE corner of Lot 1 of Block E of the Original Town of White Bird as
 41 shown on the recorded plat thereof; thence in a southerly direction along
 42 the eastern boundary of the said Lot 1 to the SE corner of the said Lot 1 of
 43 Block E of the Original Town of White Bird; thence in a northwesterly direc-
 44 tion along the southern boundary of the said Block E to a point which is the
 45 SW corner of Lot 4 of the said Block E of the Original Town of White Bird;
 46 thence in a straight line in a northwesterly direction across Main Street
 47 to a point which is the SE corner of Lot 1 of Block D of the Original Town of
 48 White Bird as shown on the recorded plat thereof; thence along the southern
 49 boundary in a northwesterly direction of the said Block D to a point which
 50 is common to the SE corner of Block D and the SE corner of Lot 7 of Block
 51 D of the Original Town of White Bird, which is the place of beginning.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE OFFICE OF MAYOR OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR THE DUTIES OF THE OFFICE; PROVIDING FOR THE AUTHORITY OF THE MAYOR TO SIGN DOCUMENTS, BORROW MONEY, OFFER REWARDS, GRANT PARDONS, EXERCISE POLICE POWERS WITHIN CERTAIN RADIUS OF THE CITY LIMITS, TO EXERCISE A VETO POWER, TO REQUIRE ACCOUNTS AND REPORTS OF OFFICERS, TO REQUIRE AID IN ENFORCING THE LAWS; PROVIDING FOR A SALARY FOR THE MAYOR; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ORDINANCE TO TAKE EFFECT UPON ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF
WHITE BIRD, IDAHO:

Section 1. MAYOR: The superintending and administrative officer of the City of White Bird, shall be the Mayor.

Section 2. DUTIES: The Mayor shall devote so much of his time to the duties of his office as an efficient and faithful discharge thereof may require. He shall preside at all meetings of the Council and shall have a vote when the Council is equally divided, and may call special meetings of the Council when necessary. He shall appoint all officers and employees of the city, subject to the approval of the Council, and have such other powers as provided by law. He shall, from time to time, provide for the Council such information and recommend such measures as he may deem beneficial to the city. He shall examine the grounds of all complaints against any officer of the city to determine existence of a violation or neglect of duty and report to the Council the evidence thereof, if deemed sufficient for the removal of such officer. He shall require that every officer, on the expiration of his term of office or resignation or removal, deliver to his successor all assets belonging to such office. He shall perform all other duties required and necessary for the efficient operation of the business of the city, and all other duties imposed by laws of the State of Idaho.

Section 3: MAYOR TO SIGN DOCUMENTS: The Mayor is authorized and empowered to sign, for and in behalf of the city, all contracts, documents and papers to which the city is a party, and to require that the conditions in any instrument are faithfully performed.

Section 4. BORROW MONEY: The Mayor may borrow money on the credit of the city when so authorized by the Council.

Section 5. REWARD: The Mayor, whenever he deems it expedient, is hereby empowered to offer a reward not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), for the arrest and conviction of any person charged with violating any of the ordinances of the City of White Bird.

Section 6. MAYOR MAY GRANT PARDONS: The Mayor is empowered to grant a pardon to any person imprisoned for a violation of any of the ordinances in the City of White Bird, and to remit so much of any fine or forfeiture as in his judgment he may deem just and reasonable, and he shall report such remittance or pardon to the Council at its next meeting.

Section 7. POLICE POWER OF MAYOR: The Mayor shall have jurisdiction over all places within five (5) miles of the corporate limits of the City of White Bird, for the enforcement of any health or quarantine ordinance or regulation and shall have jurisdiction in all matters, excepting taxation, within one (1) mile of the corporate limits.

Section 8. VETO POWER OF MAYOR: The Mayor shall have power to veto or sign any ordinance passed by the City Council, provided, that any ordinance vetoed by the Mayor may be passed over his veto by a vote of one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) plus one of the members of the full Council, notwithstanding the veto, and should the Mayor neglect or refuse to sign any ordinance and return the same with his objections, in writing, at the next regular meeting of the Council, the same shall become a law without his signature.

Section 9. ACCOUNTS AND REPORTS OF OFFICERS: The Mayor shall have the power, when he deems it necessary, to require any officer of the City to exhibit his accounts or other papers, or to make reports to the Council in writing, touching any subject or matter pertaining to his office.

Section 10. MAYOR MAY REQUIRE AID: The Mayor is hereby authorized to call on every male inhabitant in the City of 21 years of age or over, to aid in enforcing the laws.

Section 11. SALARY: The salary of the Mayor of the City shall be \$ none per month.

Section 12. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 13. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect, from and after its passage, approval and publication.

This ordinance, passed under the suspension of the rule requiring a second and third reading upon separate days, upon which a roll call vote was duly taken, is hereby enacted at a regular meeting of the City Council, held on the 7 day of July, 1967, at 8:00 o'clock, P.M., in the Council Chambers.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR A CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR ITS COMPOSITION, THE PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL, THE DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL, THE TIME AND PLACE OF ITS MEETINGS, THE CARE OF CITY FUNDS, FOR RECORDS OF THE CITY, FOR EXAMINATION OF ACCOUNTS OF OFFICERS; PROVIDING FOR PROCEDURE ON PRESENTATION AND PASSAGE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR PASSAGE OVER MAYOR'S VETO; PROVIDING FOR PRESERVATION OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR FILLING VACANCIES ON THE COUNCIL; PROVIDING FOR SALARIES FOR COUNCILMEN; PROVIDING FOR CONTINUITY OF GOVERNMENT IN EVENT OF DISASTER OR EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ORDINANCE TO TAKE EFFECT UPON ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHITE BIRD, IDAHO:

Section 1. CITY COUNCIL AND COMPOSITION: The legislative authority of the City of White Bird shall be vested in a Council consisting of four (4) members, qualified as provided by law.

Section 2. PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL: At the first meeting of the Council in January following a general city election, the Council shall, from its members, elect one Councilman to be styled President of the Council. The president of the Council shall have all powers of the Mayor when serving in that office, due to the absence of the Mayor or vacancy in the office of Mayor.

Section 3. DUTIES: The members of the City Council, the legislative and policy making branch of the government of the City, shall devote so much of their time to the duties of their office as an efficient and faithful discharge thereof may require. They shall attend all meetings of the Council unless lawfully excused therefrom by the Mayor or by a majority of the remaining members, perform all duties required of them by law and as may be assigned committees to which they may severally be appointed by the Mayor.

Section 4. TIME AND PLACE OF MEETING: The Council shall hold regular meetings on the first Friday of each month. Such meetings shall be held in the City Council Chambers and shall commence at 8:00 o'clock, P. M.. The Mayor, or one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) plus one (1) of the membership of the Council may call special meetings, the object of which must be submitted to the members in writing and the call, object and the disposition thereof shall be entered upon the Journal by the Clerk. If the regular meeting day of any month is a holiday, the meeting shall be held on the following day at the regular hour.

Section 5. CARE OF FUNDS: The City Council shall make provision for the care and safekeeping of all public funds of the City and for their deposit.

Section 6. RECORDS: The City Council shall make provisions for an adequate record system and, by ordinance, establish a classification for retention of records in accordance with the provisions of Title 50, Idaho Code.

Section 7. EXAMINATION OF ACCOUNTS OF OFFICERS: At least once in each quarter of each year, the Council shall examine, either in open session or by committee, the accounts and doings of all officers or other persons having the care, management or disposition of monies, property or business of the City.

Section 8. PRESENTATION AND PASSAGE OF ORDINANCES: All ordinances of the City shall be typewritten or printed and presented to the Council by a member at any regular or special meeting. Every such ordinance shall be read at the meetings of the Council on three different days. At such readings, it shall be open to discussion and amendment or may be referred to a committee, unless by a majority vote other disposition is made. All ordinances which have been amended shall, after the second reading, be engrossed by the Clerk as amended. On final passage, the yeas and nays shall be called and recorded and a concurrence of a majority of the full Council shall be required for passage.

Provided, however, that on the vote of one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) plus one (1) member of the Council may dispense with the portion of this section requiring all ordinances to be read on three different days, and on the vote upon the motion to dispense with this rule, the yeas and nays shall be called and recorded.

When any such ordinance is passed, it shall be signed by the Clerk, and the date of its passage by the Council shall be added thereto, and it shall, within three days thereafter, be presented to the Mayor, or, in case of his absence from the City, to the President of the Council for his approval. If he approves it, he shall attach his signature thereto.

Section 9. PASSAGE OVER VETO: Should the Mayor not approve the ordinance, he shall, before the next regular meeting after such ordinance is presented to him for his approval, return the ordinance to the Council with his objections in writing. When any ordinance is so returned by the Mayor, it shall be reconsidered by the Council at the first regular meeting thereafter. If, on such reconsideration, one half ($\frac{1}{2}$) plus one (1) of the members of the full Council shall vote in the affirmative, the ordinance shall become a law notwithstanding the Mayor's veto. The Clerk, in such cases, shall annex a certificate to the ordinance stating that it was vetoed by the Mayor and that, on its reconsideration, it received the required majority of votes.

Should the Mayor refuse or neglect to sign such ordinance and return it with his objections in writing at the next regular meeting after it has been presented to him, it shall become law without his signature. The Clerk shall annex to such ordinance a certificate to the effect that the Mayor has failed to sign or veto it, and it has, therefore, become a law without his signature.

Section 10. PRESERVATION: It shall be the duty of the City Clerk to safely keep the original ordinances as engrossed, and, after final passage, he shall copy the ordinance at length in a book to be known as Ordinance Book No. _____, which book is to be provided by the Council for that purpose and shall be kept as a permanent record of the City.

Section 11. VACANCY: In the event an office of the Council shall become vacant, through death, removal of residence, or for any other cause, the Mayor shall appoint, with the approval of the Council, a resident of the City to fill the unexpired portion of the term until the next general election, at which time the unexpired term shall be filled by regular election.

Section 12. SALARY: The salary of Councilman of the City shall be the sum of \$ None per month.

Section 13. CONTINUITY OF GOVERNMENT IN EVENT OF DISASTER OR EMERGENCY: As provided in Section 27 of the Constitution of the State of Idaho, there is hereby established the following procedure for filling the offices of the elected officials in the event of an emergency or disaster: In the event of a vacancy in the office of Mayor, only, the Councilman having the greatest years of tenure as an elected official shall succeed to that office. In the event there are, in addition to the Mayor, also vacancies on the Council, the Mayor shall be elected from any by the new Council, who shall be determined as follows: Members of the Planning Commission shall succeed to the vacancies on the Council in the order of their tenure as members of the Planning Commission, beginning with the member of the longest tenure. For expediency, all ties shall be determined by lot.

Section 14. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 15: This ordinance shall take force and be in effect, from and after its passage, approval and publication.

This ordinance, passed under the suspension of the rule requiring a second and third readings upon separate days, upon which a roll call vote was duly taken, is hereby enacted at a Regular meeting of the City Council, held on the 7 day of July, 1967, at 8:00 o'clock, P. M., in the Council Chambers.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE OFFICIAL DEPOSITORY FOR FUNDS OF THE CITY OF WHITE BIRD; PROVIDING FOR THE TREASURER TO KEEP MONIES IN SUCH DEPOSITORY; PROVIDING FOR THE TREASURER TO MAKE AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ORDINANCE TAKING EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF

WHITE BIRD, IDAHO:

Section 1. DEPOSITORY: The First Security Bank of Idaho, in the City of Grangerille, Idaho, is hereby designated as the official depository for funds of the City of White Bird. The Treasurer of the City is hereby ordered, required and directed to keep monies belonging to or in the care of the City Treasurer in the above named depository, provided, however, that when so authorized by the Mayor and Council, city funds may, by the Treasurer, be invested in securities authorized by law.

Section 2. That all ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

This ordinance, passed under the suspension of the rule requiring a second and third reading upon separate days, upon which a roll call vote was duly taken, is hereby enacted at a regular meeting of the City Council, held on the 7 day of July, 1967, at 8:00 o'clock, P. M., in the Council Chambers.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE DESIGNATION OF THE OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR THE PUBLICATION OF ORDINANCES, NOTICES AND PUBLICATIONS AS REQUIRED BY LAW TO BE MADE THEREIN; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF CONFLICTING ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE ORDINANCE TO TAKE EFFECT UPON ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL AND PUBLICATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHITE BIRD, IDAHO:

Section 1. OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER: The Idaho County Free Press, printed and published in the City of Spangville, in the County of Idaho, State of Idaho, be, and is hereby, designated as the official newspaper of the City of White Bird, and such ordinances, notices and publications as are required by law to be given publication in a newspaper shall be published in such Idaho County Free Press.

Section 2. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage, approval and publication.

This ordinance, passed under the suspension of the rule requiring a second and third reading upon separate days, upon which a roll call vote was duly taken, is hereby enacted at a regular meeting of the City Council held on the 7 day of July, 1967, at 8:00 o'clock, P. M., in the Council Chambers.
