ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

89 AUG 22 AM The Undersigned natural person of the age of twenty-one or more years, acting as an incorporator under the provisions of the Idaho Corporation Act, adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this Corporation is Equestrian Enterprises International, Inc.

ARTICLE II.

Period of Duration.

The duration of this Corporation is to be perpetual.

ARTICLE III.

Purposes and Powers.

Section 1. <u>Purposes</u>. The purposes for which this Corporation is organized are as follows to transact and engage in any and all lawful business activities for which corporations may be incorporated under the laws of the State of Idaho.

Section 2. <u>Powers</u>. This corporation shall have all the powers specified in the Idaho Business Corporation Act.

ARTICLE IV.

Stock Clauses.

The aggregate number of shares which this Corporation shall have authority to issue is 1,000 common shares, no par value. The Corporation shall not have the authority to issue shares in series.

ARTICLE V.

Registered Office and Registered Agent.

The address and post office box of the registered office of this corporation is 340 Second Street, and Post Office Box 3545, Ketchum, Idaho. The name of the initial registered agent of this corporation at that address is Nan Grable Emerick, Sun Valley

Executive Services.

ARTICLE VI.

Directors.

The number of Directors shall be as specified in the Bylaws of this Corporation and such number may from time to time be increased or decreased in such manner as described in the Bylaws and may be fewer than three in the event that the Corporation has less than three shareholders, in accordance with the laws of the State of Idaho. The initial Board of Directors shall consist of 1(one) member. The names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as directors until the first annual meeting of shareholders or until successors be elected and qualify are as follows: Leticia Villegas.

ARTICLE VII.

Incorporators.

The name and address of the incorporator of this Corporation is Leticia Vilegas, 340 Second Street, Ketchum, Idaho.

ARTICLE VIII.

Provisions for Regulation of Corporation's Internal Affairs.

Section 1. <u>Meetings of Shareholders and Directors</u>. <u>Meetings</u> of the Shareholders and Directors of this Corporation may be held either within or without the State of Idaho at such place or places as may from time to time be designated in the Bylaws or by resolution of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. <u>Bylaws</u>. The initial Bylaws of this Corporation shall be adopted by its Board of Directors. The power to amend or repeal the Bylaws or to adopt new Bylaws shall be in the shareholders, but the affirmative vote of the holders of more than two-thirds of the shares entitled to vote in a meeting of shareholders called for such purpose shall be necessary to exercise that power. The Bylaws may contain any provisions for the regulation and management of this corporation which are consistent with the Idaho Business Corporation Act and these Articles of

Incorporation.

Section 3. <u>Compensation of Directors</u>. The Board of Directors shall have the authority to make provision for reasonable compensation to its members for their services as directors and fix the basis and conditions upon which this compensation shall be paid. Any director may also serve the corporation in any other capacity and receive compensation therefrom in any form.

Section 4. <u>Contracts in which Directors Have an Interest</u>. The Bylaws of the corporation shall provide for the handling of contracts or transactions in which Directors may have a financial interest, whether direct or indirect.

Section 5. <u>Indemnification of Directors and Officers</u>. The Bylaws of the corporation shall provide for the circumstances in which Directors and officers of the corporation may be entitled to indemnification.

ARTICLE IX.

Amendment of Articles of Incorporation.

These Articles of Incorporation may be amended in any respect conformable to the laws of the State of Idaho by an affirmative vote of more than two-thirds of the shareholders entitled to vote in a meeting of shareholders called for such purpose as prescribed by law.
