The undersigned, acting as the incorporator of a nonprofit corporation ("Nonprofit Corporation") organized under and pursuant to the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, Chapter 3, Title 30, Idaho Code ("Act"), adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for the Nonprofit Corporation.

ARTICLE I. NAME.

The name of the Nonprofit Corporation shall be "Idaho Youth Golf Association, Inc."

ARTICLE II. PURPOSES

The exclusive purposes for which the Corporation is organized and will be operated are as follows:

- To conduct charitable and educational activities, within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under such Section 501(c)(3).
- To exercise all powers granted by law necessary and proper to carry out the abovestated purposes, including, but not limited to, the power to accept donations of money, property, whether real or personal, or any other thing of value. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize or permit the Nonprofit Corporation to carry on any business for profit, to exercise any power, or to do any act that a nonprofit corporation formed under Act, or any amendment thereto or substitute therefor, may not at that time lawfully carry on or do.
- To transact any and all lawful business, consistent with the purposes stated above, C. for which nonprofit corporations may be incorporated under the laws of the State of Idaho, as they may be amended from time to time.

ARTICLE III. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The affairs of the Nonprofit Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors. The Board of Directors shall consist of not less than three (3) but no more than five (5) individuals. The actual number of Directors shall be fixed by the Bylaws of the Nonprofit Corporation. Other than the Directors constituting the initial Board of Directors, who are designated in the Secretary of State

ARTICLE VI. MEMBERS

The Nonprofit Corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE VII. NONPROFIT STATUS

The Nonprofit Corporation is a not for profit corporation.

ARTICLE VIII. PERIOD OF DURATION

The period of duration of the Nonprofit Corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE IX. LIMITATIONS

No part of the net earnings or the assets of the Nonprofit Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons except that the Nonprofit Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article II hereof. Notwithstanding any other permitted to be carried on by a Nonprofit Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on by a Nonprofit Corporation exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time.

ARTICLE X. DISTRIBUTION ON DISSOLUTION

Upon dissolution of the Nonprofit Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all liabilities of the Nonprofit Corporation, distribute all the assets of the Nonprofit Corporation consistent with the purposes of the Nonprofit Corporation to such organization or organizations as shall at the time qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended from time to time, in such manner as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so distributed shall be distributed by the district court of the county in which the principal office of the Nonprofit Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organizations, as such court shall determine to be consistent with the purposes of the Nonprofit Corporation.

ARTICLE XI. BYLAWS

Provisions for the regulation of the internal affairs of the Nonprofit Corporation shall be set forth in the Bylaws.
