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KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, the undersigned. BERT H. MORRIS, CAROLYN J. MORRIS, and WILLIAM J. DEE, each being a natural person of full age, and a citizen of the United States of America, have voluntarily and do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and we do hereby certify, declare and adopt, the following articles of incorporation.

I.

The name of this corporation shall be MORRIS DISTRIBUTING CO.

II.

The period of existence and duration of the life of this corporation shall be perpetual.

III.

The location of the registered office of this corporation shall be Grangeville, County of Idaho, State of Idaho, and the address of the registered office of this corporation shall be Grangeville, Idaho.

IV.

The nature of the business and the objects and purposes to be transacted, promoted and carried on are to do any or all of the things herein mentioned, as fully and to the same extent as natural persons might or could do, and in any part of the world, viz.:

To manufacture, experiment, invent, develop, improve, purchase, sell, and generally deal in heating and heater supplies, fixtures, tools, appliances, sanitary fixtures, and any and every kind of wares, articles and merchandise which are or may be used to carry on the business of manufacturers, wholesalers, retailers, importers and exporters in heating fixtures and supplies, and any and all kinds of wares and merchandise concerned or connected thereto and

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l therewith; to install and repair furnaces, stoves, heating plants, electrical heating, gas heating, and any and all other types of heating in buildings, residences, and any other type of structure or place in which heating can be installed; to carry, buy, sell, both at wholesale and retail, all the wares, inventory, merchandise, fittings, fixtures and supplies necessary thereto; to act as distributor, both at wholesale and retail for all types of heating oils, gas, and electricity or any other method and form of heating for buildings, residences, and other places in which any type or 10 method of heating is required or used.

To conduct the business of filling and service station, which 12 business shall include the dealing is gasoline and all the pet-13 roeum products; all kinds of oils and products used for motor 14 fuel and lubrication; all matters of accessories and appliances 15 be used on motor vehicles of every description, and other articles 16 and items of interest useful to or desirable for patrons of such a filling station; the washing, polishing and storing of motor 18 vehicles; and such in other business as is usual, proper, necessary 19 in such enterprise.

20 To engage in the buying and selling, at wholesale and retail, 21 of rubber automobile tires and truck tires and any other tires of 22 all kinds and descriptions and the conducting of the general busi-23 ness of vulcanizing, reenforcing, rebuilding and repairing auto-24 mobile, vehicle and truck tires of all kinds and descriptions, and 25 such other and further objects as may be necessary and incidental to the carrying on of such business, including the buying and owning of the necessary tools and equipment for the business and 28 the buying, leasing, holding, releasing, selling and conveying the real estate necessary proper in connection with the business.

To buy and sell, export, import, lease, exchange and generally 31 deal in machinery and equipment of all kinds and descriptions and to act as agent for all or any set purposes; to acquire by purchase,

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lease, or otherwise, to equip, maintain and operate a general machine shop and foundry and to do repairing, blacksmithing, electrical work and any and all machine shop work as necessary to maintain and repair machinery, vehicles and equipment.

To buy, sell, trade, manufacture, deal in, deal with goods, wares, merchandise of every kinds and nature, and to carry on such business, wholesalers, retailers, importers, exporters; to acquire all such merchandise, supplies, materials, and other articals as shall be necessary or incidental to all such business; to hold, acquire, mortgage lease, and convey real and personal property in any part of the world, so far as necessary or expedient in conducting the business of the corporation; to have any and all powers above and set forth as fully as natural persons, whether as principals, agents, trustees, or otherwise.

To engage in and operate a general hardware and merchantile business, and to deal in, buy, and sell general hardware, electrical and gas appliances, housewares, toys, general merchandise including paints and painting supplies, but not excluding any other article of merchandise sometimes delt in by hardware establishments.

To acquire by lease, purchase, gift, devise, contract, concession, or otherwise, and to hold, own, develop, explore, exploit, improve, operate, lease, enjoy, control, manage, or otherwise turn to accounts, mortgage, grant, sell, exchange, convey, or otherwise dispose of, wherever situated, within or without the State of Idaho, any and all real estate, lands, options, concessions, grants, land patents, franchises, rights, privileges, easements, tenements, estates, hereditaments, interests, and properties of every kind, nature and description whatsoever.

To purchase real estate, make and purchase materials for the construction of buildings; to erect buildings; to own, manage, operate, lease and sell buildings; to conduct and carry on the businessof builders and contractors for the purpose of building, eregt+

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ing, altering, repairing or doing any other work in connection with any and all classes of buildings, structures, and improvements, of every kind and nature whatsoever; also, to buy or otherwise acquire realestate, and to subdivide, plat and sell the same, and generally tobuy, sell and deal in real and personal property of every kind and description, and to own, hold, improve, develop and manage any real estate or personal property and to erect and cause to be erected on any lands owned, held or occupied by the corporation, buildings or other structures with their appurtenances and to mortgage, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any lands or interests in lands and in any buildings or other structures at any time owned or held by the corporation; to conduct a general brokerage, agency and commission business for others in the purchase, sale and management of real estate for others and the negotiation of loans thereon; in general, to conduct a general building and construction business and a general real estate business.

To manufacture, purchase, or otherwise acquire, hold, own, sell, assign, transfer, lease, exchange, invest in, mortgage, pledge or otherwise encumber or dispose of and generally deal and trade in and with, both within and without the State of Idaho, and in any part of the world, goods, wares, merchandise, and property of every kind, nature and description.

To enter into, make and perform contracts of every kind and description with any person, firm, association or corporation, municipality, body politics, country, territory, state, government, or colony or dependency thereof.

To acquire, and to make payment thereafter in cash or the stock or bonds of the corporation, or by undertaking or assuming the obligations and liabilities of the transferror, or in any other way, the good will, rights and property, the whole or any part of the assets, tangible or intangible, and to undertake or assume the liabilities of, any person, firm, association or corporation, to

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hold or in any manner dispose of the whole or any part of the property so purchased; to conduct in any lawful manner the whole or any
part of the business so acquired and to exercise all of the powers
necessary or convenient for the conduct and management thereof.

To adopt, apply for, obtain, register, produce, take, purchase exchange, lease, hire, acquire, secure, own, hold, use, operate, contract, or negotiate for, take licenses or other rights in respect of, sell, transfer, grant licenses and rights in respect of, manufacture under, introduce, sell, assign, collect the royalties on, mortgage, pledge, create liens upon, or otherwise dispose of, deal in, and turn to account, letters patent, patents, patent rights, patents applied for or to be applied for, trade-marks, trade names and symbols, distinctive marks and indications of origin or ownership, copyrights, syndicate rights, inventions, discoveries, devices, machines, improvements, licenses, processor, data, and formulas of any and all kinds granted by, or regognised under or pursuant to the laws of the United States of America, or of any other country or countries whatsoever, and with a view to the working and development of the same, to carry on any business, whether manufacturing or otherwise, which the corporation may think calculated, directly or indirectly, to effectuate these objects.

To underwrite, subscribe for, purchase, invest in, or reinvest, acquire, hold, pledge, hypothecate, exchange, sell, deal in and dispose of, alone or in syndicates or otherwise in conjunction with others, stocks, bonds, debentures, mortgages and other evidences of indebtedness and obligations of any corporation, association, partnership, syndicate, entity, person or governmental, municipal, or public authority, domestic or foreign, and evidences of any interest, in respect of any such stocks, bonds and other evidences of indebtedness and obligations; to issue in exchange therefor its own stock, bonds or other obligations, and, while the owner or holder of any such, to exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of owner-

ship in respect thereof, and, to the extent now or hereafter permitted by law, to aid by loan, subsidy, guaranty or otherwise, those issuing, creating or responsible for any such stocks, bonds or other evidences of indebtedness or obligations or evidences of any interest in respect thereof.

To borrow or raise money for any of the purposes of the corporation, without limit as to the amount, and in connection therewith, to grant collateral or other security either alone or jointly with any other person, firm or corporation, and to make, execute, draw, accept, endorse, discount, pledge, issue, sell, or otherwise dispose of promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange, warrants, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness, negotiable or non-negotiable, transferable or non-transferable, and to confer upon the holders of any of its obligations such powers, rights and privileges as from time to time may be deemed advisable by the Board of Directors, to the extent permitted under the General Corporation Law of the State of Idaho; to lend and advance money, extend credit, take notes, open accounts and every kind and nature of evidence of indebtedness and collateral security in connection therewith.

To purchase or otherwise acquire, hold, sell, pledge, transfer or otherwise dispose of shares of its own capital stock, provided that the funds or property of the corporation shall not be used for the purchase of its own shares of capital stock when such use would cause any impairment of the capital of the corporation, and provided further, that shares of its own capital stock belonging to the corporation shall not be voted upon directly or indirectly.

To have one or more offices, to carry on all or any of its operations and business and without restriction or limit as to amount; to purchase, or otherwise acquire, to hold, own, mortgage, sell, convey or otherwise dispose of real and personal property of

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every class and description in any of the states, districts, territories, dependencies, possessions or colonies of the United States.

IN GENERAL, to do any or all of the things herein set forth to the same extent as natural persons might or could do and in any part of the world, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, or otherwise, within or without the State of Idaho, either alone or in company with others, and to carry on any other business in connection therewith, and to do all things not forbidden, and with all the powers conferred upon corporations by the laws of the State of Idaho.

It is the intention that each of the objects, purposes and powers specified in each of the paragraphs of this Fourth Article of this Certificate of Incorporation shall, except where otherwise specified, be nowise limited or restricted by reference to or inference from the terms of any other paragraph or of any other Article in this Certificate of Incorporation, but that the objects, purposes and powers specified in this Article and in each of the Articles or paragraphs of this Certificate shall be regarded as independent objects, purposes and powers, and the enumeration of specific purposes and powers shall not be construed to restrict in any manner the general terms and powers of this corporation, nor shall the expression of one thing be deemed to exclude another, although it be of like nature. The enumeration of objects or purposes herein shall not be deemed to exclude or in any way limit by inference any powers, objects, or purposes which this corporation is empowered to exercise, whether expressly by force of the laws of the State of Idaho, now or hereafter in effect, or impliedly by any reasonable construction of said law.

V.

In furtherance, and not in limitation of the powers conferred by statute, the Board of Directors is expressly authorized:

To make and alter by-laws of this corporation, to fix the amount to be reserved as working capital over and above its capital

stock paid in, and to authorize and cause to be executed mortgages and liens upon the real and personal property of this corporation.

If the by-laws so provide, to designate two or more of its members to constitute an executive committee, which committee shall for the time being, as provided in said resolution or in the by-laws of this corporation, have and exercise any or all of the powers of the Board of Directors in the management of the business and affairs of this corporation, and have power to authorize the seal of this corporation to be affixed to all papers which may require it.

Pursuant to the affirmative vote of the holders of at least a majority of the stock issued and outstanding, having voting powers, given at a stockholders' meeting duly called for that purpose, or when authorized by the written consent of at least a majority of the holders of the voting stock issued and outstanding, the Board of Directors shall have power and authority at any meeting to sell, lease or exchange all of the property and assets of this corporation, including its good will and its corporate franchises, upon such terms and conditions as its Board of Directors deems expedient and for the best interest of the corporation.

This corporation may in its by-laws confer powers upon its directors in addition to the foregoing, and in addition to the powers and authorities expressly conferred upon them by statute.

VI.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$25,000.00), divided into twenty-five hundred shares at the par value of TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00) per share of stock. No distinction shall exist between the shares of this corporation and all such shares shall have the same rights in the corporation.

VII.

All or any portion of the capital stock may be issued for cash or in payment for real or personal property, services, or any other right or thing of value, for the uses and purposes of the

corporation, and when so issued shall become and be fully paid, the same as though paid for in cash at par; and the directors shall be the sole judges of the value of any property, right or thing acquired in exchange for capital stock.

## VIII.

From time to time the capital stock may be increased according to law, and may be issued in such amounts and proportions as shall be determined by the Board of Directors, and as may be permitted by law.

IX.
