The undersigned, in order to form a Corporation under the provisions of Title 30, Chapter 3, Idaho Code, submits the following articles of incorporation:

Article 1:

The name of the corporation shall be Soul Food Extravaganza, Inc.

Article 2:

The purpose for which this corporation is organized is to promote the awareness of the diverse cultures represented in the Treasure Valley Community through shared, enlightening, and entertaining experiences, while supporting charitable causes. Proceeds from activities shall be used and/or distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article 3:

The street address of the registered office is: 1307 Warren Street, Boise, ID 83706, and the registered agent at such address is: Leisa Carter.

Article 4:

The board of directors shall consist of no fewer than four (4) people. The names and addresses of the directors are:

Article 6:

The mailing address of the corporation shall be Post Office Box 6402, Boise, Idaho 83707.

Article 7:

The corporation does not have voting members.

Article 8:

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

Article 9:

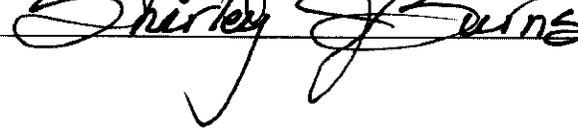
Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
