ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

ALBERTSON-DICKARD FUNERAL HOME, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That the undersigned, Burnard T. Albertson, Robert F. Bickard, and Myrtle E. Dickard, all residents of the State of Idaho, each and all citizens of the United States of America, and each and all of the age of majority, do hereby associate themselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Idaho, and to that end do hereby adopt and execute the following Articles of Incorporation, and do hereby certify and declare:

ARTICLE I.

That the name of said corporation is and shall be Albertson-Dickard Funeral Home, Inc.

ARTICLE II.

That said corporation is formed for the following purposes:

(a) Undertaking, embalming, and directing of funerals of deceased persons, the building and maintenance of a funeral chapel, and the dealing in and selling of coffins and caskets, and all such property, goods, wares, and merchandise as are incidental to and used in the business of undertakers and morticians, and also the buying, owning, holding, selling, letting, leasing, and dealing in and with real and personal property of every kind and nature and also the owning and operating of motor

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vehicles and such other modes or wehicles of conveyance for hire, which motor vehicles or other conveyances now are or may be used in the ordinary course of the business of undertaking, embalming, funeral directing and ambulance service.

- (b) To receive, acquire, hold, purchase, dispose of, convey, mortgage, and/or lease, real and personal properties; to dispose of, sell, lease, sign, transfer, mortgage and/or convey any rights, privileges, franchises, real or personal property of the corporation, other than its franchise of being a corporation, and to acquire, purchase, guarantee, hold, mortgage, own, vote, sell, pledge and/or otherwise dispose of and deal in shares, bonds, securities and debentures and other evidences of indebtedness, of its own and of other corporations, domestic and/or foreign.
- (c) To enter into, make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and for any lawful purpose, without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association, corporation, municipality, state or government, or any subdivision, district or department thereof.
- (d) To do any and all such other acts, things, business or businesses in any manner connected with or necessary, incidental, convenient or auxiliary to any of the objects herein-before enumerated, or calculated, directly or indirectly to promote the interest of the corporation and to carry on its purpose, or for the purpose of attaining or furthering in any of its businesses.

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ARTICLE III.

That the location and post office address of the corporation shall be at Buhl, Twin Falls County, State of Idaho.

ARTICLE IV.

That, subject to dissolution, in the manner provided by law, the duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE V.

That the amount of the authorized stock of said corporation shall be \$25,000 divided into 2,500 shares of common stock, of the par value of \$10 per share.

ARTICLE VI.

That the names and post office addresses of each of the incorporators and the number of shares subscribed by each is as follows:

ARTICLE VII.

The private property of the stockholders of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts to any extent, whatever, and the shares of the corporation shall not be subject to assessment for the purpose of paying expenses, conducting business, or paying debts of the corporation.

ARTICLE VIII.

The number of directors of the corporation shall be

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as specified in the By-Laws, provided the number of directors of the corporation shall not be less than three (3) nor more than five (5). In case of any increase in the number of directors, the additional directors may be elected by the directors then in office, and the directors so elected shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the stockholders and until their successors are elected and qualified.

All officers of the corporation shall be stockholders except as hereinafter provided. The secretary and treasurer may but need not be stockholders and in case of a corporate stockholder, stockholders of any corporate stockholders may be directors and/or officers of the corporation even though they hold no stock personally. Any two or more offices may be held by the same one person except the office of president and treasurer. The term of office of the officers, except as in these articles otherwise expressly provided, shall be for one year and until their successors shall have been elected and qualified, unless sooner removed or resigned, as herein provided.

ARTICLE IX.

A majority of the board of directors shall constitute a quorum and shall have power to transact the business and exercise the corporate powers of the corporation, and, except as otherwise provided herein, may mortgage, pledge, sell or otherwise dispose of real or personal property of the corporation for the purpose of carrying on the business of the corporation. The board of directors shall have power to appoint agents and servants of the corporation, prescribe their duties and remove them at pleasure.

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The board of directors or the stockholders may, by a majority vote, adopt By-Laws for the regulation of the affairs of the corporation. The By-Laws shall not conflict with these Articles of Incorporation, and may be amended or repealed only by the owners of 2/3 of the outstanding stock as may be provided for in the By-Laws adopted. The By-laws adopted by the directors shall provide the time and place of directors' meetings and the manner of calling the same, which meeting may be held within or without the State of Idaho.
