Pursuant to the provisions of § 30-1-1006 of the Idaho Business Corporation Act, the undersigned corporation adopts the following Articles of Amendment of Articles of Incorporation:

FIRST: The name of the Corporation is Klassic Builders Inc.

SECOND: The purpose of these Articles of Amendment to Articles of Incorporation is to change the name of the Corporation from "Klassic Builders Inc." to "Olympus Building Group Inc." Accordingly, Article 1 of the Articles of Incorporation is amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following new Article 1:

"ARTICLE 1. Name. The name of the corporation is Olympus Building Group Inc."

THIRD: Article 3 of the Articles of Incorporation is amended by deleting it in its entirety and replacing it with the following new Article 3:

"ARTICLE 3. Registered Office and Registered Agent. The address of the corporation's registered office in the state of Idaho is 935 West 7th South, Rexburg, Idaho 83440. The name of the corporation's registered agent at such address is R. Benjamin Young."

The undersigned corporation further certifies as follows:


1. The foregoing Articles of Amendment of Articles of Incorporation were approved and adopted by the shareholders of the corporation effective as of May 6, 2005.
