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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
SENIOR CITIZENS, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, all residents of the State of Idaho, and citizens of the United States of America, over the age of 21 years, for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation pursuant to Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code, for the purposes expressed herein, do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be STAR-EAGLE SENIOR CITIZENS, INC.

ARTICLE II

The location and postoffice address of the registered corporate office is Star, Idaho, in Ada County.

ARTICLE III

The corporation shall have perpetual directors.

ARTICLE IV

This corporation is formed without any purpose of pecuniary profit, and there shall be no pecuniary profit for the corporation, its members, or its officers. There shall be no capital stock but monthly dues may be provided for in the by-laws.

ARTICLE V

Upon the dissolution of the corporation for any cause, all the property, both real and personal, then owned or controlled by this corporation shall become the absolute property of the State of Idaho office of the O.E.O., or its successor, to be used for Senior Citizens Programs.

ARTICLE VI

All persons who are over the age of 55 years, and the totally handicapped, are eligible for membership regardless of race, religion or political viewpoint.

The board of directors may determine in each case whether a person is totally handicapped for membership purposes. The rights and interests of all members shall be equal, and no member can have or acquire a greater interest therein than any other member. All members shall be entitled to one vote.

ARTICLE VII

This corporation is formed for the general purpose of providing and promoting social and other benefits for its members and other Senior Citizens. Social benefits include, but are not limited to, improvement, protection, mutual help, insurance, education, recreation and entertainment.

ARTICLE VIII

For the purpose of carrying out said objectives and purpose, the corporation may, with the authority of two-thirds of the board of directors, acquire and receive in its corporate name by purchase, gift, grant, or bequeath, any real or personal property, and to hold, transfer, sell, mortgage, convey, let, or otherwise use the same.

ARTICLE IX

The affairs of this corporation shall be conducted by a Board of Directors. All directors must be members of the corporation. The board shall consist of at least 5 members and not more than 15 the exact number to be decided by the general membership at their annual meetings. Directors shall serve for one year.

ARTICLE X

The corporation shall have as its officers a President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary. The officers shall be elected by the general membership at the annual meeting and shall serve for one year.

ARTICLE X

The officers may be, but need not be, directors. The officers shall have such duties as those officers normally and usually have, which duties may be more particularly designated in the by-laws. All deeds and other instruments shall be signed by all of said officers.

ARTICLE XI

The annual membership meeting shall be held on the second Wednesday of each month at 12:30 at the corporate offices in Star, Idaho.

ARTICLE XIII

The private property of the members of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts and no member shall become individually liable or responsible for any debts or liabilities of the corporation.
