AGREED AND PRESENTS, That We, The undersigned, have this seventh day of December, A.D., 1901, voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a CORPORATION under and in compliance with the Laws of the state of Idaho: And we hereby certify:

1. That the name of this said proposed Corporation is:

2. That the purposes for which this Corporation is formed, are:

To purchase, construct, own, maintain and operate irrigating ditches and canals for domestic, agricultural, manufacturing and mining purposes; To acquire, hold and transfer all privileges, rights and property, both real and personal, necessary for such purposes; To furnish water for said purposes upon a co-operative plan; And to make all contracts incidental and necessary therefor:

3. That the place where this Corporation's principal business will be transacted is the City of Caldwell, County of Canyon and State of Idaho:

4. That the term during which this Corporation shall exist is fifty years, from and after the date of its incorporation:
