FIRST ARTICLES OF AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF
YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION OF IDAHO FALLS, INC.

Robert Tripp, the President, and N. Charles Hedemark, the Secretary, of the Young Men's Christian Association of Idaho Falls, Inc., do hereby depose and say, as follows:

1. That the said Robert Tripp is the duly elected, qualified and acting President, and that the said N. Charles Hedemark is the duly elected, qualified and acting Secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association of Idaho Falls, Inc.

2. That a regular meeting of the members of the Young Men's Christian Association of Idaho Falls, Inc., was duly called and held on Tuesday, December 17, 1974, at the hour of 7:30 p.m., for the purposes of considering a proposal that the Articles of Incorporation be amended, and following full discussion of the proposed amendments, the members unanimously voted in favor of adopting the proposed Resolution to amend its Articles of Incorporation, as follows:

By striking therefrom paragraph 2 and by adding to said Articles of Incorporation new paragraphs 2 and 12, so that the Articles of Incorporation of the Young Men's Christian Association of Idaho Falls, Inc., shall read, as follows:

2. It shall be the purpose of this corporation:

(a) To promote the religious, moral, intellectual and physical well-being of individuals by providing and maintaining for them dining halls, lecture and entertainment halls, rest and recreation rooms, libraries, play grounds, dormitories, gymnasiums and school rooms, religious, educational and industrial instruction, and friendly councils, advise and assistance, and by establishing subsidiary associations or organizations for like purposes, the same to be maintained in whole or in part or assisted by this corporation.

(b) In and for the accomplishment of the above purposes, to acquire and receive by lease, purchase, donation or otherwise, any property, real, personal or mixed, and to hold, lease, mortgage, or use the same in any manner deemed most conducive to its interest and prosperity

(c) To borrow money for the general and special purposes of this corporation and to give as evidence therefor, bonds, coupon notes, promissory notes, or other evidence of indebtedness, and to mortgage, pledge, give or convey in trust any or all of the property, real and personal, of this corporation to secure the payment thereof.

(d) To accept grants-in-aid, gifts and donations of every kind and nature, but for the purposes only set forth herein, and such authority shall never be exercised for profit or gain.

(e) Except as such authority is inconsistent with the above stated purposes and the rights granted to a nonprofit corporation in Idaho, and except as such authority is inconsistent with the provisions of these Articles, this corporation shall have the powers enumerated in Section 30-114, Idaho Code.

(f) To have specifically, and exclusively, a charitable, religious and educational purpose for all of its activities, and to have no purpose nor engage in any activity which would not be charitable, educational or religious within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the

Internal Revenue Code of 1954.

12. Upon dissolution of this corporation by operation of law or otherwise, all assets of the corporation shall be distributed to a government body or a nonprofit corporation or corporations with like objectives and with tax exempt status under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code as is presently enacted.

That by the unanimous consent of those members voting at the meeting therefor referred to hereinabove, to the adoption of the aforesaid Amendments, the corporation's Articles of Incorporation are amended as set forth hereinabove.

12. Upon dissolution of this corporation by operation of law or otherwise, all assets of the corporation shall be distributed to a government body or a nonprofit corporation or corporations with like objectives and with tax exempt status under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code as is presently enacted.
