ARTICLE 2. CORPORATE PURPOSE

Section 1. Nonprofit Purpose

This corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Section 2. Specific Purpose

Thomas Thomas Chamber Players, Inc. stages the public performance of art-type piano and piano chamber repertoire performed by pianist (and Snake River Plain native/current Island Park resident)

Thomas Mansom Thomas and his chamber collaborators—chamber in this case defined as one musician per musical part.

The specific objectives within this purpose shall be to:

- Collaborate with and showcase musicians (instrumentalists; vocalists; composers; music scholars; etc) with the unique voice of the Greater Yellowstone eco-region and its situating ecosystems: the Rocky Mountains; the Snake River drainage basin; the Missouri River drainage basin; the Colorado Plateau; and the Great Basin.
- Showcase built spaces within that geographic region of historical or particular design interest as
 quality acoustical spaces for concerts and community bonding, including moving a piano to
 worthy locations not commonly used as music venues and especially remembering
 smaller/remote communities for whom such in situ chamber concerts would be exceptional.

<u>Or:</u>

Render audible for a wider audience the regional character that is a certain earthiness combined with strong spiritual ambition, born of our unique ecology and heritage.

- 3. Present to audiences superb instruments in a fine state of regulation and in fine tune.
- 4. Include a strong educational component within each concert, contextualizing aesthetic trends within the greater art-music tradition.
- 5. Build lasting relationships with particular audiences through extended musical explorations presented in a series of concerts in the same locale.
- 6. Maintain an effective library of musical scores and musical research materials to facilitate these performance and educational objectives.

ARTICLE 8: DISTRIBUTION OF ASSETS UPON DISSOLUTION

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
