



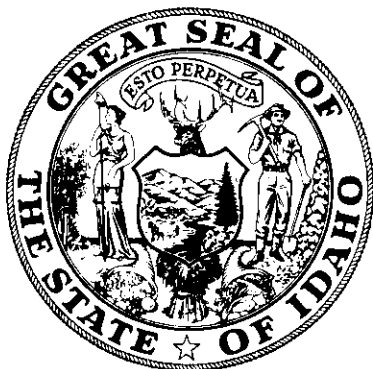
CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
ADA COUNTY CHAPTER 22, DISABLED AMERICAN
VETERANS DEPARTMENT OF IDAHO, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That WE, the undersigned, natural persons of the age of twenty one years or more; at least two of whom are citizens of the State of Idaho acting as incorporators of a corporation under Non-Profit Corporation Act, pursuant to Chapter 3, Title 30 Idaho Code, do hereby adopt the following Articles for such Corporation.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is ADA COUNTY CHAPTER 22, DISABLED AMERICAN VETERANS DEPARTMENT OF IDAHO, INC.

ARTICLE II

This is a non-profit corporation and is formed without any purpose of pecuniary profit for the corporation, its members, its officers or board members; however, the By-laws may provide for membership dues, fees, and/or assessments consistent with the needs of the corporation to fulfill its purposes, and consistent with Title 30, Idaho Code. It shall comply with applicable provisions of Section 501A and 501C of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States of America.

ARTICLE III

The period of existence and duration of the corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

1. To uphold the Constitution and Laws of the United States.

2. To realize the true American ideals and aims for which those eligible to membership fought.

3. To advance the interest and work for the betterment of all wounded, gassed, injured and disabled veterans.

4. To cooperate with the United States Veterans Administration and all other public and private agencies devoted to the cause of improving and advancing the condition, health and interest of all wounded, gassed, injured and disabled veterans.

5. To stimulate a feeling of mutual devotion, helpfulness and comradeship among all wounded, gassed, injured and disabled veterans.

6. To serve our Comrades, our communities and our country and to encourage in all people that spirit of understanding; which will guard against future wars.

This corporation will not as a substantial part of its activities carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislators. This corporation shall not participate in or intervene in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE V

This corporation recognizes the National Organization, known as Disabled American Veterans, Incorporated by Act of Congress, and affirms its allegiance, and subordination, to said National Organization, its constitution, By-Laws and all rules, mandates and regulations promulgated pursuant thereto.

ARTICLE VI

The management of the affairs of this corporation is vested in its members through an Executive Committee whose selection and authority shall be prescribed in the By-Laws of the corporation

pursuant to Title 30, Chapter 3, Section 314, Idaho Code.

ARTICLE VII

The location and post office address of the initial registered office of said corporation shall be 11166 Chickadee Drive, Boise, County of Ada, State of Idaho 83709, and the initial agent shall be DALLAS R. DOUGLAS, 11166 Chickadee Drive, Boise, Idaho 83709.

ARTICLE VIII

The corporation shall consist of every member in good standing, or any person who shall become a member in good standing of Ada County Chapter 22, Disabled American Veterans.

ARTICLE IX

Upon dissolution of the corporation , the assets remaining after the payments of its debts, shall be distributed as provided in Article VI, Section 6.5 paragraph 4 and 5 of the National Constitution and By-Laws. (Reverts back to the Department of Idaho Disabled American Veterans).
