

AMENDMENT TO CERTIFICATE OF LIMITED PARTNERSHIP

1. That Shoe Sole Ranch, Ltd. filed a Restated Certificate of Limited Partnership with the Secretary of State for the State of Idaho on August 5, 1983.

The following described is located in Township 11, Range 18 East of the Boise Meridian, Twin Falls County, Idaho, and more particularly described as follows, to wit:

SECTION 22

E1/2 SE1/4; NW1/4 SE1/4; and that part of the NE1/4 SW1/4 described as follows, to wit:

BEGINNING at the Southeast corner of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 of said Section, thence West along the South line of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 a distance of 10 rods, thence North parallel to the East line of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 a distance of 20 rods, thence in a Northwesterly direction to a point which is 10 rods East and 20 rods South of the Northwest corner of said NE1/4 SW1/4, thence North 20 rods, parallel to the West line of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 to the North line of the said NE1/4 SW1/4, thence East along the North Line of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 to the Northeast corner of the said NE1/4 SW1/4, thence South along the East line of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 to the Southeast corner of the said NE1/4 SW1/4 to the point of beginning, together with an easement for a road right-of-way for purpose of ingress and egress to and from the SW1/4 NE1/4 of Section 26 over the presently existing road to the Northwest corner of Section 26 as is described in that certain agreement providing for said easement dated June 22, 1961, executed by R. H. Callen, et al, granting said easement to Russell C. Larsen, and Marie Maxine Larsen, husband and wife.

BEGINNING at a point where the West line of said Section 26 crosses the lower tow of the embankment of said High Line Canal, thence North 48 feet to the Northwest corner of the SW1/4 SW1/4 of said Section 26, thence East along the North line of the SW1/4 SW1/4 and along the North line of the SE1/4 SW1/4 of said Section 26, a distance of 2599 feet more or less to the Northeast corner of

the SE1/4 SW1/4 of said Section 26, thence South along the East line of the SE1/4 SW1/4 of said Section 26, a distance of 395 feet to the lower toe of the embankment of said High Line Canal, thence along the lower toe, North 76°53' West 470 feet, thence, North 84°27' West 780 feet, thence North 68°52' West 420 feet, thence North 85°2' West 195 feet, thence South 83°24' West 475 feet, thence North 80°19' West 305 feet, to the point of beginning containing in all 10.78 acres, EXCEPTING an easement in favor of Twin Falls Canal Company on a strip along the toe of said embankment 50 feet in width.
