ARTICLE 2 - PURPOSE

STATE OF IDAHO

Add the following:

This corporation is organized and operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Notwithstanding any other provision of the Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation contributions to which are deducible under Section 170 (c)(2) of the internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law.

No substantial part of the activities of this corporation shall consist of carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not intervene in any political campaign including the publishing or distribution of statements on behalf or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

ARTICLE 8 - DISSOLUTION

Add the following:

Upon winding up and dissolution of this corporation, after paying or adequately providing for the debts and obligations of the corporation, the remaining assets shall be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation which is organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religions, and or scientific purposes and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

However, if the named recipient is not then in existence or no longer a qualified distributee or unable to accept the distribution, then the assets of this organization shall be distributed to a fund, foundation, or organization which is organized and exclusively for the purposes specified under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
