ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that the undersigned and hereinafter named persons have associated themselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation, pursuant to Title 30, Chapter 3 of the Idaho Code, for the purposes hereinafter expressed, and do hereby adopt the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION, also known as "FHSC".

ARTICLE II

The FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION shall be a non-profit corporation, organized pursuant to the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, and Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States of America.

ARTICLE III

The duration of FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE IV

The purposes of FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION shall be charitable. The specific and primary purposes are as follows:

- 1. To promote the general well being of farmworkers and other underserved people within and without the State of Idaho, by providing health and social services.
- 2. To contact and mobilize, to the fullest extent possible, all existing and future agencies and resources designed to provide health care and social services for needy persons in the communities served by this corporation.
- 3. To solicit and receive gifts and grants of money, property and services of every kind and to administer the same for the charitable purposes of providing health and social services for needy persons in the communities served by this corporation.

- 4. To establish health delivery for needy persons and to employ such personnel as may be necessary.
- 5. To engage in any other activities as may be necessary or appropriate for the improvement of the health and living conditions of the members of all the communities served by this corporation, as long as such activities are consistent with tax-exempt status under Section 510(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States of America.

ARTICLE V

The FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION is to have no members. The name and post-office address of the corporation which has the authority to elect Directors is as follows:

ARTICLE VI

The FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION shall have at least one Director, and the number of Directors shall be fixed by the bylaws, not to exceed twenty-five Directors.

ARTICLE VII

The number of the first Board of Directors shall be three Directors.

ARTICLE VIII

The street address of the FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION initial registered office and the name of the initial registered agent is as follows:

ARTICLE IX

ARTICLE X

The name and street address of each Incorporator shall be the same as those persons specified in Article IX, above.

ARTICLE XI

The FAMILY HEALTH SERVICES CORPORATION shall not discriminate against any person on the basis of race, age, sex, ethnicity, religion, creed, color, national origin or handicap.

ARTICLE XII

The private property of the directors of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of corporate debts and no director shall become individually liable or responsible for any debts or liabilities of the corporation.

ARTICLE XIII

Upon dissolution of this corporation for any cause, all the property, both real and personal, then owned or controlled by this corporation shall become the absolute property of a non-profit association, government agency, or foundation, chosen by a majority of the Board of Directors, that is engaged in charitable activities within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. If the organization is a private organization, it must qualify for an exemption from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of the United States of America. There shall be no distribution to any director or employee of the corporation.

ARTICLE XIV

If any portion of these Articles of Incorporation shall be invalid or inoperative, so far as it is reasonable and possible:

- 1. The remainder of these Articles shall be considered valid and operative, and
- 2. Effect shall be given to the intent manifested by the portions held invalid or inoperative.
