ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION SEGRETARY OF STATE

OF

ST. MARY'S SCHOOL FOUNDATION OF MOSCOW, IDAHO, INC.

KNOW ALL BY THESE PRESENTS:

The undersigned, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Idaho Nonprofit Corporation Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

I.

The name of the Corporation is ST. MARY'S SCHOOL FOUNDATION OF MOSCOW, IDAHO, INC.

II.

The Corporation is a nonprofit corporation. The Corporation is irrevocably dedicated to and operated exclusively for non-profit purposes; and no part of the income or assets of the Corporation shall be distributed to, nor inure to the benefit of, any individual.

III.

The period of its duration is perpetual.

IV.

The purpose or purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

- a. To attract substantial support from contributions, directly or indirectly, from persons and sources within and without the St. Mary's Parish of Moscow, Idaho, community.
- b. To stimulate the interests of students, faculty, alumni and friends of St. Mary's School, or its successor, if ever one there be, in its development of educational programs.
- c. To assist in the public relations of St. Mary's School, or its successor.
 - d. To contribute to St. Mary's School, or its successor.

- e. To accept, hold, invest, reinvest and administer any gifts, bequests, devises, benefits of trusts (but not to act as trustee of any trust), and property of any type or kind, without limitation as to amount or value, and to use, disburse or donate the income from said property solely for the purposes provided in these Articles of Incorporation.
- f. Generally, the Corporation may have and exercise all such powers as are by law conferred upon such corporations of like character, and, in carrying out its purposes the Corporation may do any and all things necessary thereto and may exercise any and all powers not prohibited by these Articles of Incorporation or law, and not prohibited to non-profit tax-exempt corporations.

V.

The Corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

VI.

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article IV hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the Corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the Corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the Corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

VII.

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the District Court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes. In the event of qualification as above stated, disposition shall be made to The Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise for the use and benefit of St. Mary's Parish in Moscow, Idaho, and in the event of disqualification, then, to The Roman Catholic Diocese of Boise for its general uses and purposes.

VIII.

The private property of the members of this Corporation

shall not be subject to the payment of any corporation debt.

IX.

The address of the initial registered office of the Corporation is 412 North Monroe, Moscow, Idaho 83843, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Sister Shirley A. Garibaldi.

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The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors of the Corporation is seven (7), and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as directors until the first annual meeting of members or until their successors are elected and shall qualify are:
