The place where its principal business is to be transacted is Burmah, in Lincoln County, Idaho.

The term for which it is to exist is fifty years.

The number of its directors shall be three.

The amount of its capital stock and the number of shares into which it is divided, is nothing.

The amount actually subscribed, none.
