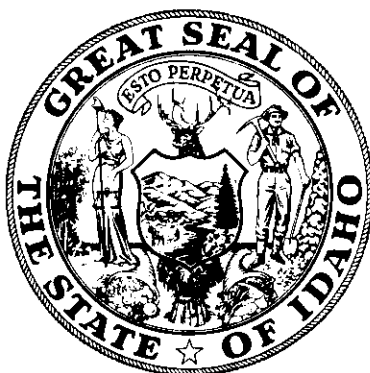

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

BOISE VALLEY CHAPTER OF JAPANESE AMERICAN CITIZENS LEAGUE, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we the undersigned, being natural persons of full age and citizens of the United States and the State of Idaho, in order to form a corporation for the purposes hereinafter stated, pursuant to Chapter 10 of Title 30 of the Idaho Code, do hereby certify as follows:

I.

That the name of said corporation shall be "BOISE VALLEY CHAPTER OF JAPANESE AMERICAN CITIZENS LEAGUE, INC.."

II.

The corporation formed hereby shall have no capital stock, and shall be composed of members rather than shareholders.

III.

This corporation is one which does not contemplate pecuniary gain or profit to the members thereof and is organized for nonprofit purposes and no part of any net earnings thereof shall inure to the benefit of any member or other individual.

IV.

The private property of the members of this corporation shall not be liable for its corporate debts.

V.

The rights and interests of all members shall be equal, and no member shall have or acquire a greater interest therein than any other member, and

no certificate of membership can be transferred or assigned so that the transferee thereof can by such transfer become a member of the corporation, except by resolution of the board of directors and under such regulations as the by-laws may prescribe.

## VI.

The purposes of this corporation are as follows:

1. To promote the welfare of Americans of Japanese ancestry in a program of education to forward the high purposes of American citizenship and ideals.
2. To promote, encourage, and foster a feeling of good fellowship, friendship, and good will among the members of this corporation and all peoples.
3. To receive, acquire, hold, purchase, dispose of, convey, mortgage, and lease real and personal property necessary to carry out the objects of this corporation.
4. To make, perform and carry out contracts of every kind and description pertaining to the purposes of this corporation and for any lawful purposes necessary and expedient thereto with any person, firm, association or corporation. To borrow or raise money without limit as to amounts by popular subscription, or otherwise, which might from time to time become necessary to carry out the purposes of this corporation.
5. To do all and everything necessary, suitable or proper for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, the attainment of any of the objects, or the furtherance of any of the powers hereinbefore set forth, either alone or in connection with other corporations, firms, associations or individuals, and either as principals or agents, and to do every other act or acts, thing or things, incidental or appurtenant to or growing out of or connected with the aforesaid objects, purposes or powers, or any of them.
6. To do each and everything necessary, for the attainment of any one or

more of the objects herein enumerated, or which shall at any time appear conducive to the benefit of the members of the said corporation.

7. To do any and all acts and things necessary to comply with all laws of the State of Idaho dealing with Nonprofit Cooperative Associations as set forth and referred to in Chapter 10 of Title 30 of the Idaho Code.

VII.

This corporation is to have perpetual existence.
