

AMENDED AND RESTATED NON-PROFIT  
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION  
FOR HEAP HERDERS, INC. #277794

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ARTICLE I – NAME

This name of this non-profit association shall remain Heap Herders Inc.

ARTICLE II – OBJECTIVES

To promote interest in various types of hot rods, street rods, classic, restored, etc. and associated activities.

To create good fellowship, skill and sportsmanship among the members, local communities, and general public.

ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION AND REQUIREMENTS

SEC. 1 – MEMBER QUALIFICATIONS:

To be considered for membership the applicant must be sponsored by a club member and/or attend three club functions, meetings excluded. An application must be presented to the club membership for an acceptance or rejection vote. The applicant cannot be present at this meeting. If the prospective member is accepted they must be present at the next business meeting, dues must be paid at that time, and be introduced by the Vice-President.

The acceptance or rejection of the new member must be as voted by the majority of the members attending the meeting which the application is presented by secret ballot.

SEC. 2 – ACTIVE MEMBERSHIP

Will have voting privileges on all issues requiring membership approval.

Must be current with dues at all times.

Attend meetings, social and other events as members schedule allows.

May belong to other active local car clubs, national or state organizations that do not present conflict.

SEC. 3 – HONORARY MEMBERSHIP

Active members may at any time request honorary membership. Honorary members cannot vote and will not receive club perks. May receive a copy of the club newsletter.

SEC. 4 – REVOKED MEMBERSHIP

A membership can be revoked due to interfering with the harmony of the organization. The revocation of the membership must be as voted by the majority of the members attending the meeting which the revocation is presented by secret ballot.

ARTICLE IV – MEETING AND ACTIVITIES

Regular meetings will be held twelve (12) time a year, with approved exceptions.

Social functions will be decided by the social chairperson or as requested and planned by an active club member.

ARTICLE V – DUES

Dues will be \$25.00 a year. Dues are to be paid at the January meeting each year and will become delinquent March 1<sup>st</sup>.

Member's whose dues become delinquent will not be considered as members and removed from the club roster and mailing list. After members are removed from the roster, a new application for membership will be required.

ARTICLE VI – OFFICERS

The elected officers of the association will be a President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. These officers will constitute the Board of Directors of the association and will be responsible for the everyday operation of the association.

The Board of Directors shall hold their office for not less than one (1) full year. Any officer may request to continue serving in the office to which they were elected with approval of club members.

Officers will be nominated from the floor at the September meeting, election will be by secret ballot. The term of office will be October to October.

ARTICLE VII – USE OF PROPERTY, ASSETS, AND NET EARNINGS

No part of the property and assets of this association and no part of the proceeds from any event shall inure to the benefit or is distributed or used for any private member. In accordance with the Laws of the United States and State of Idaho governing non-profit associations, all property, assets, and net earnings belong to the association.

ARTICLE VIII – DISSOLUTION

Upon any dissolution of this association, it's property and assets shall be distributed as follows.

- Sec. 1 All liabilities and obligations of the association shall be paid, satisfied, and discharged or adequate provisions shall be made.
- Sec. 2 Assets held by the association upon condition requiring return, transfer, or conveyance, which condition occurs by reason of the dissolution, shall be returned, transferred, or conveyed in accordance with such requirement.
- Sec. 3 Any remaining assets shall be transferred or conveyed to one or more charitable organization.

Except any taxation for Federal Income Tax purposes as may be specified in a plan of distribution adopted by the Board of Directors, provided that no part of the assets of the corporation be distributed upon dissolution to any private member.

ARTICLE IX – AMENDMENTS


