and as such are subject to the rights, privileges and limitations granted to Non-Profit Cooperative Associations as provided in Chapter 10, Title 30, Idaho Code.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

SQUAW CREEK GRAZING ASSOCIATION

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We, the undersigned, all of whom are residents of the State of Idaho, and being citizens of the United States, being of legal age, do hereby voluntarily associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a non-profit corporation, with no capital stock, under the authority of Idaho Code 30-1001.

ARTICLE I

The corporate name of this Association shall be:

SQUAW CREEK GRAZING ASSOCIATION, INC.

ARTICLE II

The purpose or purposes for which said Association is former are:

- (a) To engage in the business of providing by purchase, lease or otherwise, lands for grazing and recreational purposes in the State of Idaho, for the use and benefit of its members and not for the purpose of direct gain to the Association itself, and to make possible the acquisition, control, conservation and the shift in use of lands that are now crop farmed, to lands that will be used for grazing and recreational purposes, only, to the end that the members of said Association may stabilize their farming and ranching operations and to the further end, that lands that are now producing crops will be planted to grass, and thereafter used for grazing and recreational purposes and to do other things not forbidden by law.
- (b) To hold, purchase, acquire, lease and convey real and personal estate; to borrow money for the use and needs of the Association; and to pledge and/or mortgage, real, personal and intangible property of the said Association as security therefor.
- (c) To levy assessments upon its members for the acquisition by lease, purchase or otherwise, of grazing or forage producing lands and for the construction and maintenance of improvements, operation, repair and betterments of grazing lands; for the maintenance of equipment and facilities thereon, and for payment of the lawful obligations of the Association.
- (d) To do any and all things that may be incident or conducive to the aforesaid objects, or any of them, and exercise the usual powers of corporate bodies.
- (e) To sue and be sued, complain and defend in any court of law or equity.
- (f) To have a corporate seal, which may be altered at pleasure and to use the same by causing it or a facsimile thereof, to be impressed or affixed or reproduced or otherwise.
- (g) To appoint such officers and agents as the business of the association shall require and to allow them suitable compensation.

To make by-laws not inconsistent with the constitution or laws of the United States, or of this state, for the management of its property; the regulation and government of its affairs and for the certification and transfer of its membership certificates. To wind up and dissolve itself, or to be wound up and dissolved in the manner provided by the statutes of this state. ARTICLE III The principal place of business of the Association shall be located at Ola, Idaho. ARTICLE IV The affairs of the Association shall be under the control of five (5) directors, and those who shall as directors manage the affairs of the Association, for the first year and until their successors are duly elected and qualified are: Laurence Perkins Ola, Idaho Ola, Idaho Ola, Idaho Ola, Idaho Homer Beal James Herold Elvin Melvin Schmelzer E.S. Sweet, Idaho Boyd Butler At the first annual meeting following the expiration of the one year period for which the directors herein designated will serve, and at each annual meeting thereafter, a new Board of Directors shall be elected in accordance with the provisions of the By-Laws of the Association and the laws of the State of Idaho, in such cases made and provided. ARTICLE V This Association shall have no capital stock. Section 1. Membership in the Association shall be evidenced by membership certificates issued to applicants qualifying for membership and paying the membership fee, as provided in these Articles of Incorporation and in the By-Laws of the Association. Section 2. Membership in this Association shall represent the right to share equally with all other members the lands and factlities of the Assocation for grazing purposes, subject to the payment of establishing grazing fees and assessments, and subject to the provisions of the By-Laws and regulations adopted by the Board of Directors to prevent overgrazing and other practices detrimental to the lands owned or operated by the Association. Each membership shall entitle the holder thereof to a right and interest equal to the right and interest represented by any other membership issued by said Association as herein stated. Section 3. Membership in this association shall be limited to operators of family size farms, with rights as to length of tenure and proximity of location to the grazing controlled by the Association, sufficient in the judgment of the Board of Directors, to enable such operators to make full beneficial use Membership in this association shall be limited of the grazing and services furnished by the Association. A family size farm shall be construed to mean a farm operated by one family which provides the entire management and more than fifty percent of the labor for such operation. -2Section 4. Membership in this Association shall be transferable and subject to mortgage or pledge only upon the approval of the Board of Directors. The above provision shall be recited in all certificates of membership issued.

ARTICLE VI

The By-Laws of the Association for the management of its affairs shall be adopted by the members of said Association, and said members will be empowered to amend or repeal said By-Laws in accordance with the provisions thereof.

ARTICLE VII

Cumulative voting shall not be allowed.

ARTICLE VIII

This Association shall have perpetual existence.

ARTICLE IX

The address of the initial registered office shall be Ola, Idaho, and the name of the initial registered agent, for service of process, in James Herold.

ARTICLE X

The individual and private property of the members shall not be liable for the debts of the Association.
