Purpose Clause

This corporation is organized as a church exclusively for charitable, religious, and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Revenue Law), including, but not limited to, for such purposes, preserving and securing the principles of biblical faith so as to uphold the liberties inherent in each church member and the freedom of action of this church with respect to other churches of like faith; maintaining and fostering public worship; preaching and teaching the Word of God and the Gospel of Jesus Christ; carrying on the work of the Lord Jesus Christ for the extension of His Kingdom throughout the earth; and engaging in any other activity not prohibited to corporations under the [State] Not-For-Profit Corporation Act that is in furtherance of Section 501(c)(3) purposes.

Dissolution Provision

Upon the dissolution of the church, after paying or making provision for payment of all the liabilities of the church, the trustees shall dispose of all of the assets of the church to such organizations formed and operated exclusively for religious purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law). Assets may be distributed only to tax-exempt organizations which agree with the church's Statement of Faith
