ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

FARMLAND IRRIGATION COMPANY, INC.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That we, the undersigned, being natural persons and of full age and citizens of the United States, by these presents associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation pursuant to the corporation laws of the State of Idaho, and we do hereby certify as follows:

Ι

The name of the corporation is FARMLAND IRRIGATION COMPANY, INC.

II

The corporation is formed for the following purposes:

To engage in the business of manufacturing, buying,
selling, and distributing, both wholesale and retail, leasing,
servicing, repairing, installing, and otherwise dealing in all
types and kinds of irrigation systems and equipment and the
component parts therefor.

To enter into, make, perform, and carry out contracts of every kind and for any lawful purpose, without limit as to amount, with any person, firm, association, corporation, municipality, state, or government, or any subdivision, district, or department thereof.

To receive, acquire, hold, purchase, dispose of, convey, mortgage and/or lease real and personal property, to dispose of, sell, lease, assign, transfer, mortgage and/or convey any rights, privileges, franchises, real or personal property of the corporation, other than its franchise of being a corporation,

and to acquire, purchase, guarantee, hold, mortgage, or vote, sell, pledge or otherwise dispose of and deal in buying bonds and securities and debentures and other evidence of indebtedness of other corporations, foreign or domestic.

To exercise all authority conferred upon corporations by Section 30-114 of the Idaho Code of 1947 and in addition thereto to purchase its own stock and to enter it upon its books as treasury stock or to cancel it or to re-issue it and in general to deal and trade in its own stock.

III

The corporation is to have perpetual existence subject only to the dissolution in the manner as by law provided.

IV

The location and postoffice address of the registered office of the corporation is Rupert, Idaho.

V

The amount of capital stock of this corporation shall be and is Fifty Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$50,000.00) divided into five hundred (500) shares of the par value of One Hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$100.00) per share.

The private property of the stockholders of the corporation shall not be subject to the payment of the corporate debts to any extent whatever, and the shares of the corporation shall not be subject to assessment for the purpose of paying expenses, conducting business, or paying debts of the corporation.

VIII

The number of Directors of the corporation shall be as specified in the By-Laws, and such number may from time to time be increased or decreased in such manner as may be prescribed in the By-Laws, provided the number of Directors of the In case of any corporation shall not be less than three. increase in the number of Directors, the additional Directors may be elected by the Directors then in office, and the Directors so elected shall hold office until the next annual meeting of the stockholders and until their successors are elected and qualified.

IX

The Board of Directors is expressly authorized to repeal and amend the By-Laws of the corporation and to adopt new By-Laws, and the corporation reserves the right to amend, alter, change or repeal any provision contained in these Articles of Incorporation in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by law by a majority vote of the shareholders represented in person or by proxy at any annual meeting of the shareholders or at any meeting duly called for that purpose, except where the laws of the State of Idaho otherwise provide.
