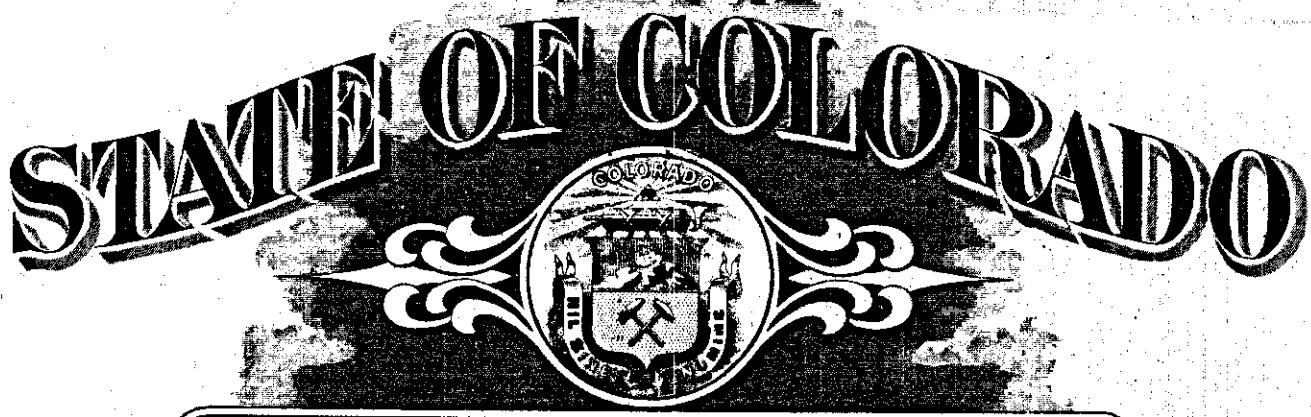

CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, J. F. WELBORN,
J. B. MARKS and FRED FARRAR, residents of the State of Colorado,
have associated ourselves together as a corporation under the
name and style of THE COLORADO FUEL AND IRON PRODUCTS COMPANY,
for the purpose of becoming a body corporate and politic under
and by virtue of the laws of the State of Colorado, and in
accordance with provisions of such laws we do hereby make,
execute and acknowledge in duplicate this certificate in writing
of our intention so to become a body corporate.

1. The corporate name and style of said corporation shall
be

THE COLORADO FUEL AND IRON PRODUCTS COMPANY.

2. The object for which said corporation is formed is to
deal in the products of The Colorado Fuel and Iron Company and
its subsidiaries, that is to say in steel and iron products,
in coal, coke, coal by-products, fluorspar, manganese, dolomite
and in any and all other commercial products mined, manufactured
or produced by The Colorado Fuel and Iron Company or its sub-
sidiaries, and to that end this company may buy, contract for,
receive on consignment, or otherwise acquire said products or any
of them, and to sell or otherwise dispose of said products so
acquired in any legitimate commercial manner or transaction.

For the purposes of its primary object this company shall
have the power to acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, real
estate, warehouses and all other facilities and equipment neces-
sary for its purposes and shall have the power to borrow money
when and if necessary in its business, to issue its evidences of
indebtedness therefor, and to secure the same by lien upon or
other pledge of its property, when so authorized in accordance
with law, and to sell, convey and otherwise dispose of any and

- all property, real or personal, acquired by it.
5. The capital stock of said corporation is Twenty-five Thousand (\$25,000) Dollars, divided into Two hundred Fifty (250) shares, par value of One hundred (\$100) Dollars per share. Said stock shall be non-assessable.
4. Said corporation shall exist for a term of Twenty (20) years unless sooner terminated in accordance with law.
5. The affairs and management of said corporation shall be under the control of a Board of three Directors and J. F. Welborn, J. B. Marks and Fred Farrar are hereby selected and named as such Directors to manage the affairs of said corporation for the first year of its existence and until their successors are duly elected and qualify.
6. The principal business of said corporation shall be conducted in the City and County of Denver, State of Colorado, but its business may also be conducted in states other than the State of Colorado, into which it may desire to enter as a corporation for the purpose of conducting its business.
7. The principal office of said corporation shall be located and kept at 820 Boston Building, Seventeenth and Champa Streets, in the City and County of Denver, State of Colorado, and J. B. Marks is hereby designated as the Agent of said corporation in charge of said office.
8. The original stock ledger and the original books of account of said corporation shall be kept at the principal office thereof in the City of Denver, State of Colorado.
9. Cumulative voting shall not be allowed for the election of Directors of said corporation.
10. The Board of Directors shall have power to make such lawful By-Laws as they may deem proper for the management of

the affairs of this corporation in accordance with the statutes
in such cases made and provided.
