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## **Articles of Incorporation of Mountain Home Military Affairs Committee** (continued)

**Article 2:** The purpose for which the corporation is organized is:

The purpose of the Mountain Home Military Affairs Committee shall be:

1. To support and advocate for the welfare and interests of military personnel, veterans, and their families stationed in or affiliated with Mountain Home Air Force Base.
2. To foster positive relationships between the military community and the civilian population of Mountain Home and beyond.
3. To organize and facilitate initiatives, events, and programs aimed at enhancing the quality of life for military personnel and their families.
4. To serve as a liaison between the military authorities and the local community, addressing concerns, needs, and issues affecting both parties.
5. To promote awareness and appreciation of the contributions and sacrifices made by military personnel and their families to the security and well-being of the nation.
6. To collaborate with local, state, and federal agencies, as well as other organizations, in furtherance of the aforementioned objectives.
7. To undertake any other lawful activities consistent with the goals of the organization and deemed appropriate by the Board of Directors.

**Article 8:** Upon dissolution the assets shall be distributed:

In the event of dissolution of the MHMAC, any assets remaining after the payment of debts and liabilities shall be distributed to one or more organizations exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, as the Board of Directors shall determine.

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
