

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE SMALL AND COLBY LUMBER COMPANY.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS: That we the undersigned, all of whom are residents of the United States, a majority of whom are residents of the State of Washington, have this day voluntarily associated ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the laws of the State of Washington, and to that end we do hereby certify as follows:

ARTICLE I.

The name of said corporation shall be The Small and Colby Lumber Company.

ARTICLE II.

That the objects for which said corporation ~~xxx~~ is formed are: To engage in the business of buying, selling, and manufacturing all kinds of logs and lumber, and to do a general lumbering, saw mill, and manufacturing business in the States of Washington and Idaho; to lease, purchase, sell, own, and operate saw mills, planing mills, shingle mills, and other mills in said States; to buy, sell, trade and barter for, and own lands, real estate, and personal property; to build, buy, sell, own, and operate flumes, dams, dykes, ditches, wagon roads, tramways, and railroads for the transportation of lumber, materials, merchandise, and passengers in said States; to buy, locate, construct, own, and operate water-rights to create

hydraulic power; to buy, own, build, sell, lease, and rent houses and other buildings in said States; to engage in the business of building and constructing houses, mills, and structures of all kinds for other persons; to engage in a general merchandise business in said States; to locate, purchase, own, operate, work, and sell mines and mining claims and mill sites, and to purchase, build, and operate all such quartz mills, concentrators, smelters, reduction works, and other appliances as may be necessary in and about such business of mining in said States; to borrow money for the purposes of the Company, and to execute mortgages upon the property of the Company to secure the payment thereof, to such amount and upon such terms as the Board of Trustees may think proper; to purchase, from the subscribers to the capital stock, such property, both real and personal, and rights, privileges, and franchises and other things of value, and to receive the same in payment of subscriptions to the capital stock, in such amounts as the Board of Trustees may think proper, and to issue full paid up stock therefor.

ARTICLE III.

That the amount of the capital stock of said corporation shall be One Hundred Thousand (\$100,000) Dollars, divided into One Thousand (1000) shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100) Dollars each.

ARTICLE IV.

That the term for which said corporation is formed, is

Fifty (50) years from and after this date.

ARTICLE V.

That the number of Trustees of said corporation shall be Five (5), and the names and residences of the Trustees who are appointed to manage the concerns of the Company for six (6) months from this date, (and until the election and qualification of their successors), are as follows; to wit, Albert Small, Spokane, Washington; B. B. Glascock, Spokane, Washington; L. S. Roberts, Spokane, Washington; Cassius W. Colby, Old Mission, Idaho; and Delwin S. Colby, Old Mission, Idaho.

ARTICLE VI.

That the principal place of business of this Company shall be at the city of Spokane in the County of Spokane, State of Washington; and that the Company may have such other branch places of business, in the States of Washington and Idaho, as the Board of Directors may designate.
