Purpose: The purpose of the SMRA is to expand upon an outdoor lifestyle, known and enjoyed by the communities of South Central Idaho. To preserve the family values, legacies and heritage of Soldier Mountain Ski Area, while exploring opportunities to provide education, expand recreation options and upgrade quality of service, for the benefit of the general public.
